### 16. Extension and outreach activities

Several extension and outreach activities were conducted in college.

- The REACH society of college collaborated with the MUN society to collect pads free
  of cost for distribution to the sections of the society that need them. This was
  accompanied by educational campaigns by REACH and MUN where they sought to
  remove the stigma around menstrual hygiene and also explored the intersection between
  disability and menstrual hygiene management.
- On the morning of 21 June 2020 NSS LSR organised a fulfilling session to commence the International Yoga Week that saw an immense participation by the students who performed various 'asanas' to not only ease muscles and relieve themselves of body tension but also kick start their day with positivity, energy and calmness. The session was facilitated by Yogacharya Kajal Chaudhary.
- A month-long campaign "National Road Safety Month" was observed nationally from 18<sup>th</sup> January 2021 to 17th February 2021. The theme for this year was, "Sadak Suraksha- Jeevan Raksha." To observe the National Road Safety Month, the members of NSS LSR took a pledge to be alert and safe on the roads.
- On the occasion of Shaheed Diwas, the Dean Students' Welfare Office organised a pan DU creative writing competition. The competition was aimed at channelizing one's

- To celebrate 72nd Republic Day, NSS Research Team organized the event which was packed with fun along with being informative as well. Various activities like pictorial quiz, word association game, flag making, documentary screening, pledge taking ceremony and discussions were carried out.
- Owing to the pandemic, Nexus was conducted online by NSS-LSR. With Human Rights as this year's theme, theme, Nexus'21 witnessed a virtual grand opening on Feb 26 '21. The Chief Guest for the event was Dr.Rumki Basu, professor at Jamia Millia Islamia and a renowned academician. Various events were organized that witnessed massive participation from people across colleges Out (Right) and Social symposium. Kids corner was thoroughly informative as well as fun for every kid who managed to join us. The panel discussion for Nexus was held on 26 February 2021, on Geriatric care in India.

### 17. Library development

During the period April, 2020 to March, 2021 the whole world faced the unprecedented crisis due to pandemic. During this period Library moved many steps ahead to serve the readers at their doorsteps through internet along with completing all the routine tasks within the time limits with many constrains.

#### **New features:**

- Library has extended online services by providing the access to the journals and e-books to the readers through N-List and DU databases.
- ➤ Generated the passwords online and provided to the faculty and students to access the N-List
- Provided bibliographical services on request
- Provided the access to newspapers and magazines

### **Infrastructure:**

- ➤ Library has worked hard to create the space to accommodate new books on shelves by doing major shifting of books.
- ➤ Planning for reopening the Library is also done keeping in mind the norm of social distancing; seating system in Library is reviewed and rearranged.

#### **Books:**

- ➤ Library as in continuation to its routine process procured and processed approximately 800 new books and provided the access to faculty. All subscribed journals were also procured and indexed.

### **Technology up-gradation:**

- > During this period Library has upgraded its available resources through maintenance and replacement process of computer systems
- ➤ To provide the access to the students after having the meetings with Library committee and COVID Committee Library has started issuing the books to the final year students. To maintain the COVID protocol, students were requested to fill a Google form and through which a time slot was provided to the students to visit the Library.

The department of Psychology conducted an **Online Short-term Certificate Course titled 'COVID-19: The Psychology of Human Behaviour'** with 35 students from different departments of LSR. The course, which was the first of its kind in college, commenced on the 14<sup>th</sup> of July and concluded on the 31<sup>st</sup> of July, 2020. This course was an exploration of the psychology of human behaviour, relationships and social support within the context of the unprecedented Covid-19 pandemic. The various sessions of the course were facilitated by faculty members of the psychology department on topics such as Pandemics, Psychology and Society, Impact of Covid-19 on interpersonal relationships, Covid-19 and Mental Health, Covid -19 and Labour Migration. Students were recruited into the course after a rigorous screening process. Those who completed all attendance requirements and submitted high quality assignments within the stipulated deadlines were awarded certificates at the end of the course. The course was successfully completed by each student who was recruited for it. Reflections and feedback on each session were taken from the students indicating that it was well-received and impactful.

The Institution Innovation Council, Lady Shri Ram College attended following **online Leadership talks** organized by Ministry of Education. Some of these include:

- Leadership talk by **Prof. K. Vijay Raghavan** (Principal Scientific advisor, Government of India) and Dr Abhay Jere on April 8, 2020. The talk was focused on challenging issue of Covid pandemic and ways to deal with this pandemic.
- Leadership talk by **Mr. Mahesh Babu** (CEO, Mahindra Electric Mobility Ltd.) with Dr Abhay Jere on 23 May 2020. The talk highlighted need to find solutions for covid through technology.
- Leadership talk by **Ms. Ashwini Deshpande** (Co-Founder and Director, Elephant Design) with Dr Abhay Jere on 6th June 2020. Speaker motivated everyone to unravel the creativity in themselves. She also discussed her journey as a woman entrepreneur.
- Leadership talk by **Mr. R Subramanyam, Secretary**, Department of Social Justice and Empowerment was conducted on 13th June, 2020. Mr Subrahmanyam shared the example of social innovation and its importance for our country by stating the story of TamilNadu state-tribal. Speaker also emphasized the importance of innovation and out of the box solutions for poor households to improve their lifestyle.

• Leadership talk by **Mr. Shridhar Venkat** (CEO, Akshaya Patra Foundation) with Dr Abhay Jere on 20th June 2020. Speaker provided insight into the role and functioning of The Akshaya Patra Foundation (TAPF), an NGO in India.

The sudden shift to online classes due to the unprecedented pandemic situation has created serious challenges to many students of LSR, especially students belonging to the vulnerable sections of the society. As students were facing problems due to lack of devices and network, the college constituted a Committee to facilitate inclusive education. the committee undertook the task of identifying the students and facilitating digital devices to them. The work began in early November 2020 by identifying the students who are in desperate need of devices to attend the online classes in a very systematic and sensitive manner in coordination with the teacher in charges of all 15 departments. The committee contacted many alumna groups who readily extended their support in providing the laptops. The committee closely worked with DI group of Alumna (Digital inclusion group of alumnae). The entire work was undertaken in phases by prioritizing the students as per their need, course, year etc. To date, 220 laptops have

been provided to the students to their doorstep across villages and cities in India from Manipur to Kerala. All these laptops have been provided to students on non-returnable basis.
