

The world has witnessed leaps and strides towards gender equality in opportunities and quality of life. However, gender bias is still deeply embedded in our culture. For generations, women in India have been subjected to discrimination on various fronts, owing to the regressive society and lack of awareness of their legal rights.

These rights are available to women at home, at their workplace and in the society at large. The lack of awareness is spread across all strata of society, irrespective of the level of education. This is evident with the existence of the poisonous perception of women and their role in a family and society, resulting in increasing frequency of rapes and sexual assaults, domestic violence, discrimination at work place and religion being used as a cover for discrimination.

The Constitution of India has embedded the importance of gender equality in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles.

In consideration of this, LSR's endeavour is to offer a short term certificate course on Women Laws to spread legal awareness and create a convenient legal resource for women

Online Short-Term Certificate Course "COVID-19: The Psychology of Human Behaviour

The Department of Psychology in Collaboration with IQAC

Date of Commencement: 14th July 2020

Course Outline:

This course is an exploration of the psychology of human behavior, relationships and social support within the context of the unprecedented Covid-19 pandemic. The pandemic and the measures associated with its containment (e.g. lockdowns, isolation, social distancing, wearing of masks) have had profound effects on the economy, social dynamics and mental health of individuals and communities in India. This course shall be dedicated to learning about the negotiation of the challenges created by the pandemic during a time where gross socio-economic inequalities and profound mental health impacts have come to the fore. It has become increasingly important to understand not only these challenges, but also how they can be managed in steadfast ways. Examples of topics that shall be covered in this course include the impact of pandemics on societies, the changing dynamics of intergroup relations, transformations in self and identity, the migrant labour crisis during the lockdown, impact of social distancing on close relationships, the link between social support and health and strategies to strengthen social support networks during times of 'social distancing.' Students will have an opportunity to explore constructs through readings in the popular press, but ultimately a scholarly, critical examination of the scientific literature will serve as the foundation of learning. The course will lay emphasis on experiential learning and the application of theoretical knowledge to real life situations. The specific **objectives** of the short-term course would be:

- 1. Understanding psycho-social impacts of pandemics on self, identity and societal dynamics.
- 2. Exploring the short term and long term impact of pandemics (with special emphasis on Covid-19) on mental health.
- 3. Exploring the impact of Covid-19 and its associated 'social distancing' on family interactions, friendships and intimate relationships.
- 4. Understanding how to strengthen relationships and social support networks during times of 'social distancing'.

- 2. After every session, the students are required to mail 200 words "reflections" based on the session. This will be to ensure that students are paying attention and have some take-aways from each session. These will not be evaluated.
- 3. After every module every week, students will be given four questions/assignments of 1000-1500 words each based on the four sessions. The session instructor is requested to mail her question by Friday night of that week to the course coordinator who shall mail four questions to the students. They will have an option of attempting anyone. Please complete the evaluations (grading) in a week. At the end of the course, students would have completed 3 assignments that shall determine their final grade.
- 4. The grading pattern will be the same as adopted by CBCS

O (outstanding)= marks 80 or more out of 100

A+ (Excellent)= marks 70-79

A (Very Good) = marks 60-69

B+ (Good)= marks 55-59

B (Above average) = marks 50-54

C (Average)= marks 45-49
