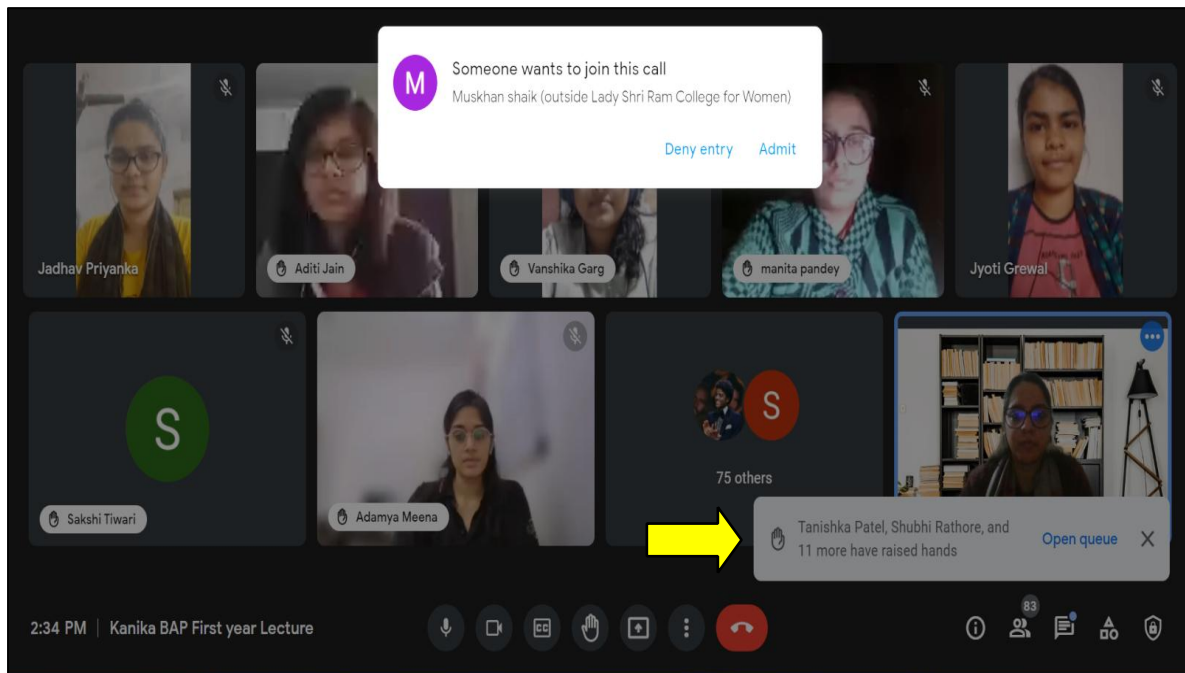
Teaching-learning processes at LSR are designed to be interactive, participatory and experiential

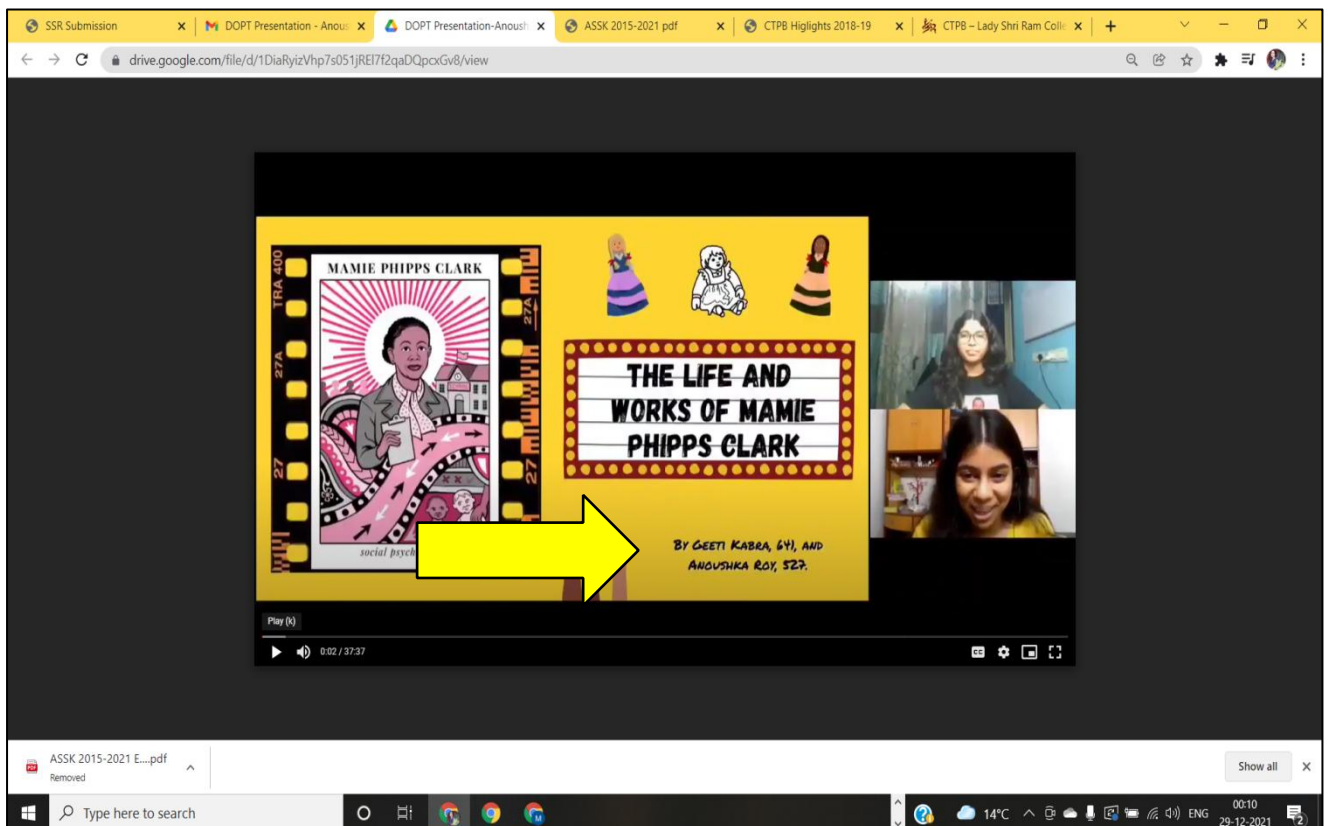

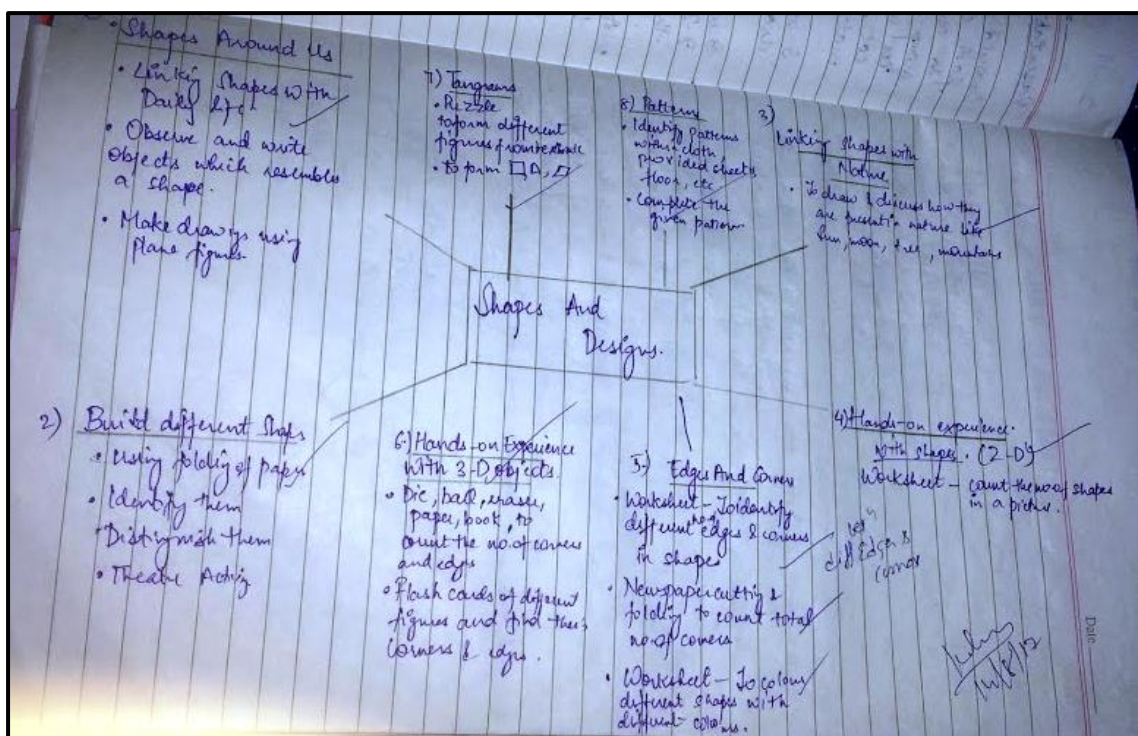

Dear Ms. Sharda,

It was very pleasant to talk to you, like always, regarding our community psychology collaboration. As discussed, this is part of the practicum work to be undertaken by 3rd year psychology (Hons) students. I am providing a few details of what this activity will look like and what we will need as support from your end. Please feel free to get in touch with me to discuss any point you wish to.

1. As before, we are planning a **mental health awareness module**, a one time intervention, for a community in need. If you could give us a sense of what the existing mental health awareness in this community is like, it would help us very much. We would be happy to invite a community worker (like Mr.Lakhan) to come to our college and talk to our students about this.
2. This time, we are hoping to address **adolescents and young adults in the age group of 12-18 years** (we can be flexible about this to encourage greater participation).
3. We will need **4 groups of 10 participants (total 40 approx)** and an **open space** where we can divide up into 4 groups like last time.
4. Please let us know if we can visit the site once before the intervention and put up mental health awareness posters. Our students are keen to do that.
5. Like last time, the total duration of activities will be about **1.5 to 2 hours** and we will come and leave on our own. We are open to visiting a different community, such as the one in chanakya puri, this time.
6. We need to positively conduct this activity by **2nd week of September (12/ 13/14th Sep** are dates we can look at)
7. Finally, like last time, we would need the community to be wheelchair accessible since a couple of our students would need that facility.


