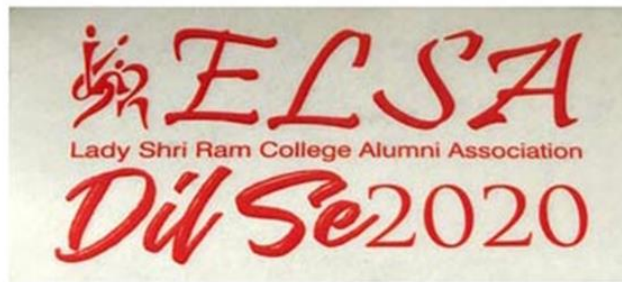

DI Committee Minutes





A series of meetings were held to discuss and finalize the modalities of facilitating laptops (or any other devices) and data packs to the 2nd and 3rd year students. **The first meeting with DI group of Alumna was held on 20th Nov 2020** which was also attended by finance committee members. The minutes of this meeting are attached separately. Following are the decisions arrived in the series of meetings held between 20th and 22nd November 2020

1 It was decided not to have endowment fund in the name of college for giving laptops as advised by finance committee due to many logistics like transfer of money from abroad, delay in the process to name a few. Instead, it was decided that DI committee of the college will be identifying the students needing the devices and the list will be given to the **DI group of alumnae (Contact person- Ms Suki Iyer)** and they will work out the logistics of delivering the devices to the students.

2 The committee decided to use both subjective (need of the students and family circumstances due to the pandemic) as well as objective criteria (income level) to identify the students who will be needing devices. The same was communicated to the Teacher in charges of all 15 departments and were asked to interact with the students and assess.




3 Since, the devices are needed urgently to the forth coming practical exams which are starting from 4th Dec 2020, it was decided to prioritize the students from Practical's based courses like Mathematics, Statistics, Commerce, Psychology.

4 As these courses need software's to run, only laptops can suit their purpose while it can be deliberated to provide tablets or laptops for other students depending on the finances available.





Minutes of the meeting held on 24th November 2020

ENGAGEMENTS WITH LSR

Meeting the team of Tarini: In March 2019, ELSAs were invited to College to interact with the all women sailors of Tarini. And join the exclusive screening of ‘**Tarini**’, National Geographic’s documentary based on the historic journey of the Indian Navy’s sailing vessel. ‘**Tarini**’ narrates the adventures of INSV Tarini at the sea and chronicles every difficulty that the vessel faced during the expedition.



Short-term course on Laws relating to Women: The short-term course commenced on 5th February 2019 and concluded on 12th March 2019 (2 classes a week spanning over 6 weeks). It covered topics including employment laws with special focus on sexual harassment of women at workplace, family laws, property laws and crime laws concerning women. The sessions were conducted by *Niti Sudhakar*, Advocate (Founding Partner, DGS Associates) with assistance from *Ms. Aditi Warriar*, Advocate; *Mr. Prosenjeet Banerjee*, Advocate (family law specialist) and *Mr. Puneet Mittal*, Senior Advocate (Crime law specialist). Students gained a lot of practical experience throughout the course, with mock trials which included scenarios concerning legal redressal of sexual harassment at workplace under the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 and dowry prohibition under the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 and the Indian Penal Code, 1860. The audience was interactive, well informed and attentive. A certification ceremony will be held in a few weeks.
