Lady Shri Ram College for Women: An Overview

Lady Shri Ram College for Women has long been recognized as a premier institution of higher learning for women in India and has been consistently ranked as one of the top colleges in the country in nationwide polls. A centre of academic excellence and achievement, it is today one of the finest institutions for Social Sciences, Humanities and Commerce, while also offering B.Sc. Programmes in Mathematics and Statistics. Professional Courses like Elementary Education and Journalism and the flagship diploma course in Conflict Transformation and Peace Building are among its strengths. Located at the cutting edge of knowledge, LSR has not just kept pace with the changing world but has been the pioneering spirit behind many innovations in the field of education. Established in 1956 in the capital city of India, by the late Sir Shri Ram in the memory of his wife, LSR had its modest beginnings in a school building in Daryaganj with 243 students, 9 faculty, 4 support staff and 3 distinct courses of study. Today, it is located in a beautiful 15 acre campus in South Delhi, has over 3500 students, about 150 faculty members, 80 administrative and support staff and 15 courses of study. In the early years, LSR provided a safe haven for young girls from conservative families who would otherwise be denied quality higher education. Today young women flock to the college from not just every part of India but from several other neighbouring countries too.

LSR has established its reputation as a training ground for women achievers who have broken the glass ceiling in different areas of endeavour. One of its most important strengths is the faculty which is known for its professionalism and commitment. The emphasis is on innovative pedagogic practices which encourage students to think critically. LSR fosters a spirit of academic excellence, informed by humanism and a celebration of diversity and inclusivity. The vision is to empower young women to be leaders and change agents who are at the same time sensitive to social issues and problems. The alumna of LSR have done pioneering work in a variety of fields – education (both urban and rural), law, media, government, the NGO sector and the corporate world. Yet many have also left promising corporate careers to work for the community. LSR has a dynamic Office of International Programmes that has initiated collaborations with universities across the globe. Students participate on a regular basis in international conferences and LSR has organized and hosted prestigious international seminars and short courses for faculty and students from varied countries. If LSR today is seen as an acronym for Leadership with Social Responsibility, it is because of the constant endeavour to sensitize students to using the privilege of their higher education as a resource for the community.

LSR has consistently highlighted issues of violence against women and has initiated sensitization programmes on gender related issues. To provide a truly inclusive environment it has a state of the art Resource Centre that enables differently abled and lesser privileged students to access the latest assistive technology. Along with academics, the stress is also on extra-curricular and co-curricular activities. LSR has an extremely active National Service Scheme, National Sports

Organization and National Cadet Corps. In addition there are several societies for extra-curricular activities like Debating, Dramatics, Dancing, Music and Creative Writing. The student societies work throughout the year at an impressive pitch providing avenues for the expression of the creative potential of the student community. LSR perceives the real challenge to be that of infusing in students a sensibility that can differentiate between just making a career and having a vocation. To help students assume leadership of movements of social transformation, LSR has nurtured four Innovative Programmes – the Voluntary Agency Placement Programme which provides opportunities for students to make a positive contribution to community development and social welfare, Dhyana the Society for Consciousness and Awareness which encourages experiential learning, the Women's Development Cell which engages with women's issues and REACH which is an acronym for Reaffirming Equity, Access, Capacity and Humanism and deals with issues of affirmative and inclusive learning.

LSR was established by the late Sir Shri Ram in the memory of his wife in 1956. Sir Shri Ram was a visionary and philanthropist who saw education as imperative to augmenting India's growth as a modern nation.

IQAC LSR recently organised an online certificate course titled 'Mathematics Teaching in the Online Mode: Pedagogical Opportunities and Challenges' with the aim to orient pre-service Mathematics teachers with opportunities provided by digital tools and other innovative methods for mathematics learning. The Department of Mathematics under the aegis of the IQAC organized a guest lecture on the topic "Efficient Solutions of Sparse System of Linear Equations" by Prof. Ramesh Chand Mittal, Professor at the Department of Mathematics, Jaypee Institute of Information and Technology. The Finance, Investment and Crisis Understanding Cell of the Economics department conducted its flagship FISCUL Week with the aim of creating awareness, initiating dialogue and promoting

learning while incorporating elements from complex real-world problems.

The Library organized a variety of exhibitions this year highlighting several themes and topics. I would like to acknowledge the hard work and dedication of the Library Staff for making all of this possible.

Our student societies are an integral part of LSR's excellence. Our department associations, societies and students make this campus a dynamic, lively and creative place all around the year.

LSR has active and energetic NSO (National Sports Organization) and NCC (National Cadet Corps) units with essential infrastructure and dedicated staff members. Our students have bagged numerous gold medals in many competitions.

LSR students constantly engage with larger social causes. The activities of the NSS unit reflect this spirit. This year NSS LSR celebrated the National Youth Day (or Yuva Diwas) organised to commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. On the occasion of Makar Sankranti, NSS-LSR in collaboration with the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav program, organized a Surya Namaskar session. It also held a documentary screening and quiz on National Girl Child Day.

With the threat of global warming and climate change on the rise, it is necessary on our part to foster environmental awareness. In that spirit, LSR observed the Environmental Week this year. Students and faculty organized exhibitions and art installations which highlighted various environmental concerns. These initiatives were well appreciated by the University of Delhi team which visited the college.

I am happy to share that LSR won the Green Cup once again this year. We are indeed proud of our lush green lawns. I want to express my gratitude to our committed garden staff who work tirelessly to maintain this beautiful campus. Our commitment to sustainable development is well reflected in our energetic pursuit of the Recycle and Reuse policy. Our innovative practices and initiatives result in wide coverage of LSR by local and national media.

The Placement Season was unprecedented this year. The number of offers increased by 20% as compared to last year's statistics, with the highest offer given to Avni Kainth from the Statistics Department at Rs. 40 lacs per annum.

I would also like to note with great satisfaction that in line with our commitment to be inclusive and egalitarian, the college offers liberal, need-based free-ship and scholarship programmes.

The College Library with its fully computerized user-friendly data filing system has an invaluable collection of about 1,24,732 books, 7162 bound journals, 1360 repro-graphic material and about 360 CDs and DVDs. It subscribes to a range of newspapers, national and international journals. The Library is linked to the Delhi University Network and DELNET, facilitating access to text and material. The Library is open from 8.00 AM to 8.00 PM and is fully computerized with an error free database of all books and bound journals, created and maintained by the in-house team.

The LSR Library has developed a service of indexing articles published in the journals procured by the Library. The data for these articles is available online. These articles are assigned subject headings according to the LC List of Subject Headings. This will be an excellent resource for faculty and students engaged in research. They will be able to access required material for their research without searching various journals. It will save them effort and time. Every reader will be able to access the required material expeditiously. There is a quarterly list of books which are added in the library during the year which is arranged subject wise and supplemented by author, title and subject indexes which serve as access points for precise and quick retrieval.



The Library has started the Current Awareness Service through e- mail. All faculty members along with students (Class representatives) are intimated about the books added during the specified period, articles indexed and news alerts. The OPAC (Online Public Access of Catalogue) is fully accessible to readers and the circulation of reading material is also fully automated. Although the Library is fully automated, there is also a parallel system for accession of books. The full record is created and maintained manually as well as on computers. Along with access to all online resources available on DU networks, the LSR Library subscribes to N-List which is an online database of journals. The Library has also taken an annual institutional membership of DELNET and all members are entitled to benefits and privileges pertaining thereto.


of activities and events created by students to celebrate philosophical discourse.

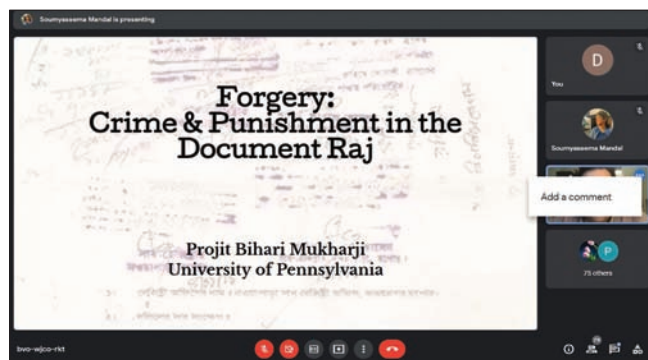

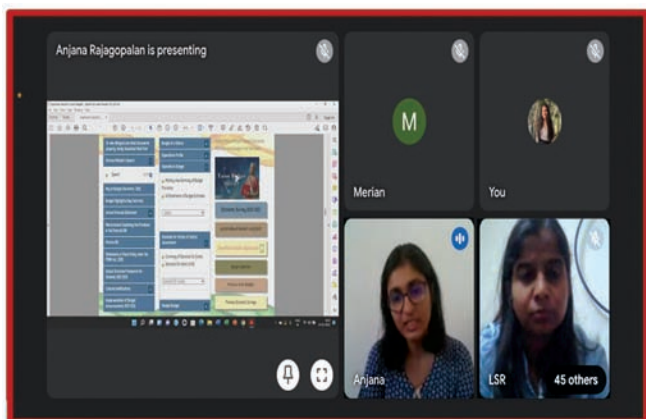
Newsletter, Ecollectual

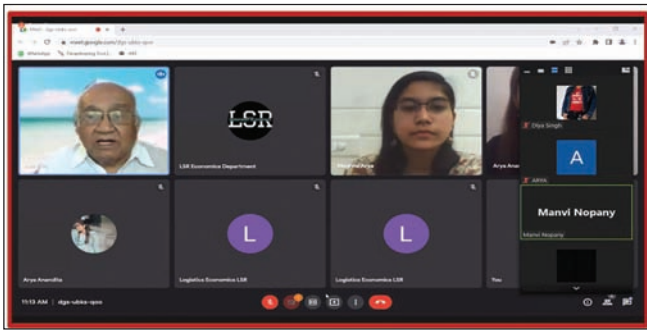
Annual Academic Meet "Econvista 2022"

The Department of Economics, hosted its Annual Economic Symposium "Econvista 2022" on 8th and 9th April, 2022, which witnessed participation from 10 contingents and several individual participants from colleges all across the country. The theme was "India's Demographic Dividend: Reviewing Economic Outlook in a Post-Pandemic World ."

The keynote speech was delivered by Dr. Kirti Parikh (Former Member, Planning Commission Chairman, Integrated Research and Action for Development (IRADE). Dr. Kirti shed light on India's demographic

dividend and dependency ratio, and the need for expanding the scope for the Indian population and economy through enabling progressive jobs and quality education. He also reiterated that tackling unemployment and increasing female labour force participation rate are quintessential in moving forward.

After the keynote lecture, Econvista 2022 started off with a panel discussion, held via zoom, with an esteemed panel including Mr. PC Mohanan, Ms. Andrea Wojnar, Dr. Satyendra Mishra, Dr. Neethi P, moderated by Prof. Suresh Babu M. The panel critically addressed their views on India's demographic dividend in the post-COVID period. Prof. Babu asked panelists thought-provoking questions based around whether India is stuck in a 'capability trap' and the future of the labor market in a post-pandemic world. He also pointed out that the structural transformation from agrarian to service economy has worked well in pulling people out of poverty but in a way has created a loop of middle income due to limited skills and employment generation. All the panelists talked about migration as a deterministic factor in the quality and type of employment people are willing to take up.

Association highlights

The five clubs of the Economics department, established to supplement the theoretical classroom learning with practical applications beyond the prescribed syllabus, were highly efficient in organising relevant sessions throughout the academic year 2021-22.

The Mentored Research Forum wrapped up the core team recruitment process for first years and recruited mentors for second years. A five day crash course on

research was organised for beginners or intermediate researchers. The sessions provided a step-by-step explanation on how to write a research paper. All the components of a paper from introduction to literature review, methodology and conclusion were covered in detail. There were over 150 participants in the sessions. The fifth day of the boot camp consisted of a speaker session. The speakers invited were Ms. Garima Sharma and Ms. Tarana Chauhan, who gave valuable insights on studying abroad, getting a PhD, and careers in research. There were more than 250 participants in the session. Volunteers and core team members co-authored research papers under the club.

In the month of November, Book and Documentary Review Club conducted three sessions (one per week) where a core team member discussed a popular piece of media from a unique perspective. The sessions held were: – The Big Short: Learning Finance with Ryan Gosling & Margot Robbie; The Pursuit of HappinessRags; and The Devil Wears Prada: The Economics of Fashion. The club revived the Book of the Month and Economist of the Month series on Instagram and the members worked on co-writing and co-designing social media posts on the same. The book chosen was Good Economics for Hard Times by Abhijit Banerjee and Esther Duflo and the economist highlighted was Pierre Oliver Gourinchas.

After rigorous rounds of applications and interviews, 16 proficient people from first year joined the core team. "Shark Tank"- Premiering of this renowned television series in the Indian subcontinent had initiated an unprecedented buzz among the young and old alike. To further instigate entrepreneurship, we had a "Drama and delight" session based on the TV show. Tea Time Tuesday sessions were organised to understand IKEA's unique cost cutting strategy of operation. Additionally, another session was held to understand the essence

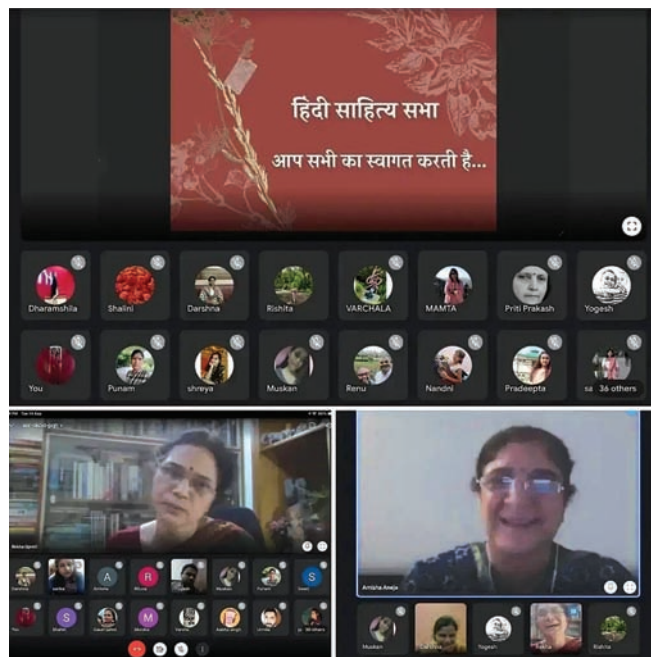

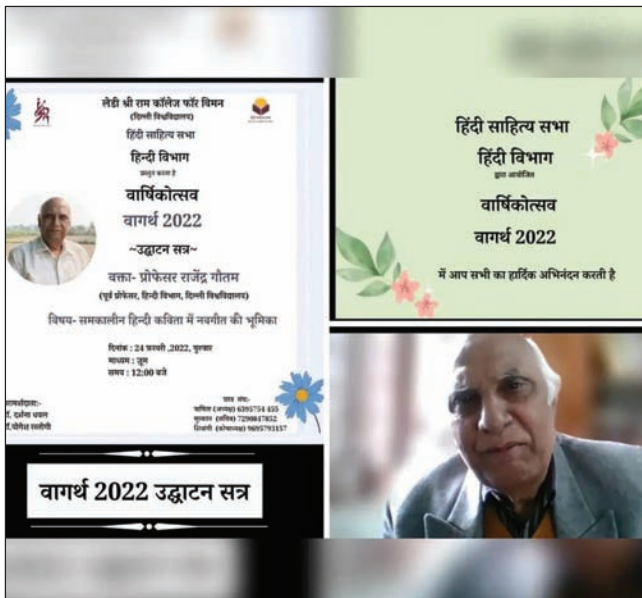

Sessions and Talks

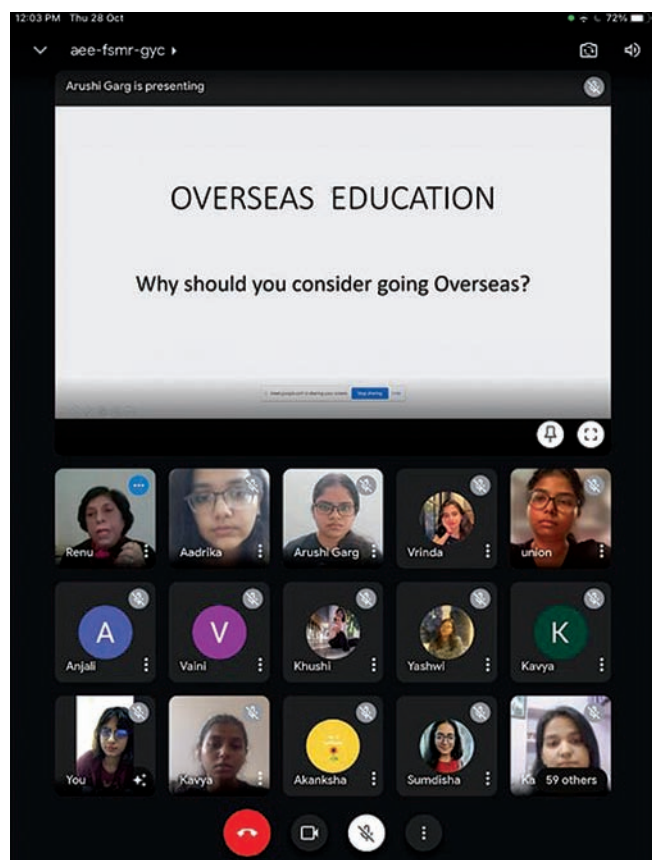

Sessions and Talks

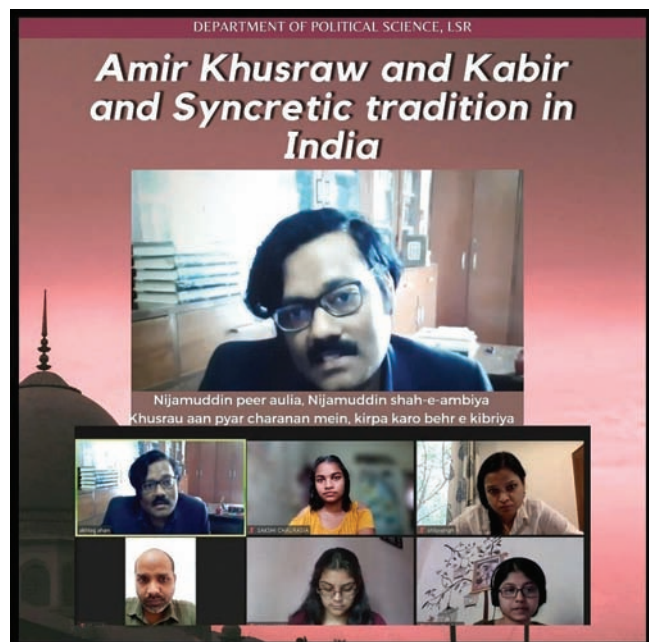

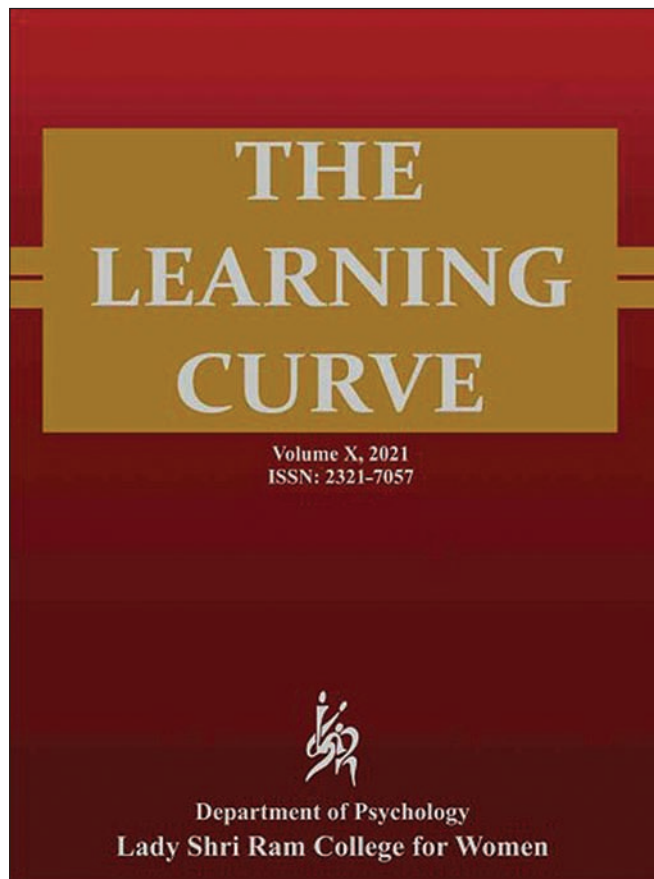

On 2nd September 2021, the department union organized an Online Teachers' Day Celebration 2021.



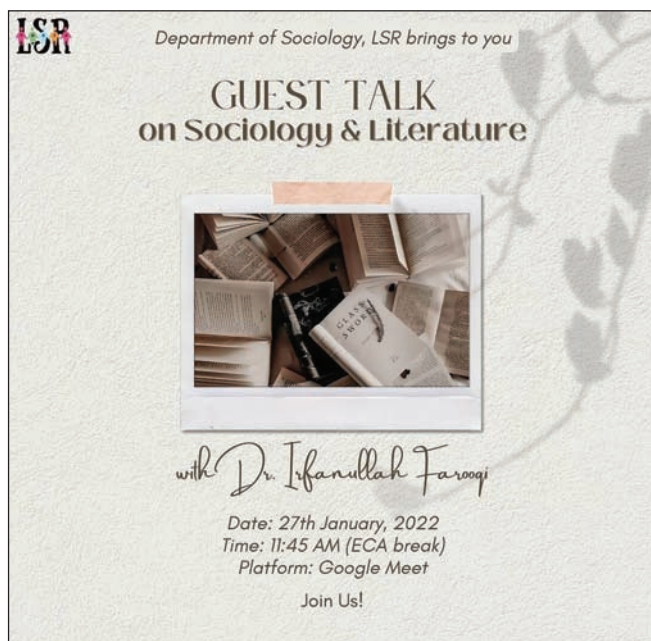

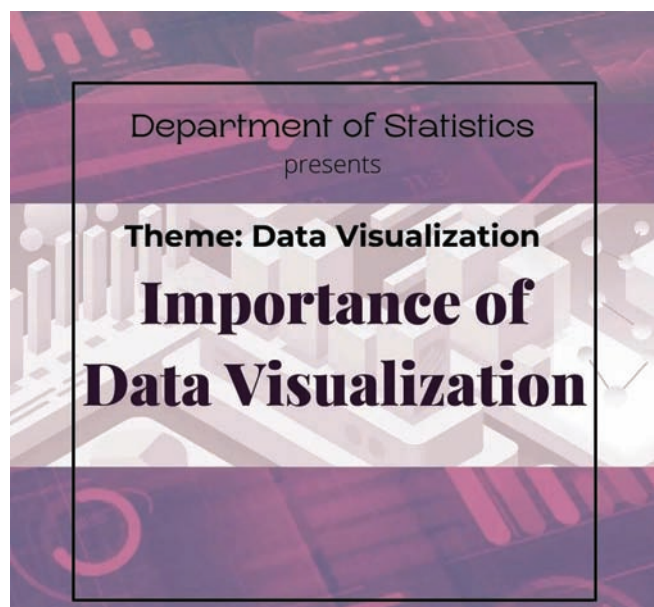

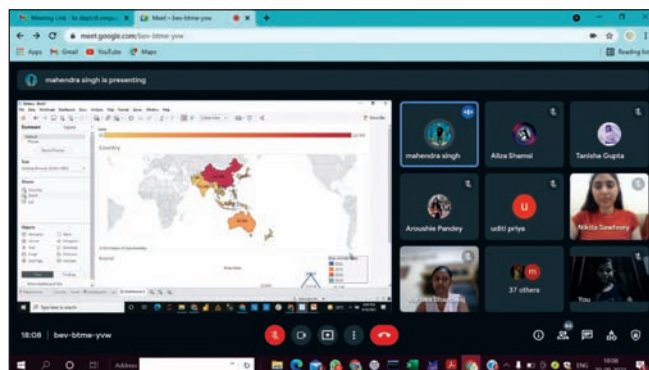
Talks and Sessions

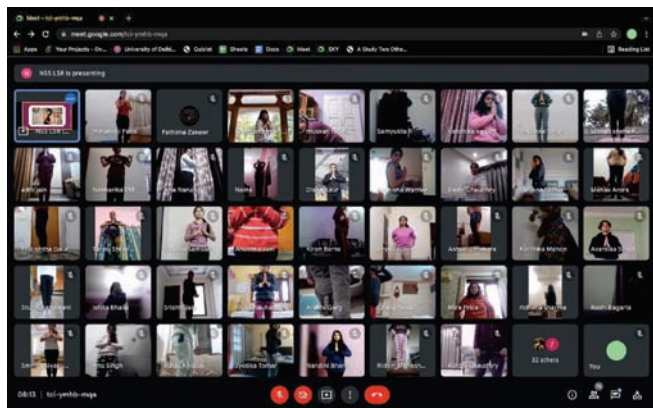

National Service Scheme

Every teaching project undertook various activities like discussion sessions to raise mental health awareness among the children. All the sessions were conducted beautifully and the response from the children was overwhelming.

National Sports Organisation (NSO)

The National Sports Organization (NSO) is one of the largest societies at Lady Shri Ram College for Women. This society comprises around 800-900 young girls, many of whom have earned numerous accolades and recognition in a wide range of sports not only at college, state and national level but also inter-university and international level. For the first time in the history of LSR, a current student of the college shooting team, Arjuna Awardee, Manu Bhaker represented India in the Tokyo Olympic Games. She is the only Indian shooter to have represented India in three events at the Olympics.

ATHLETICS

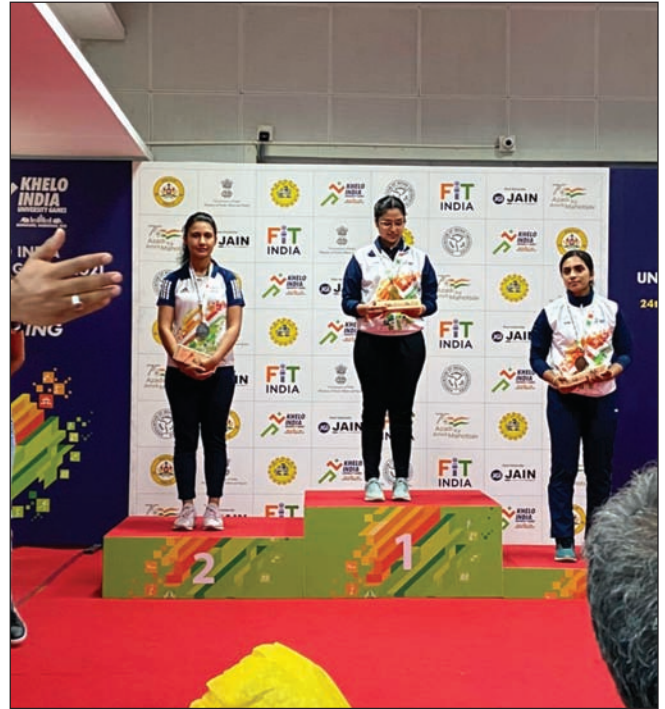

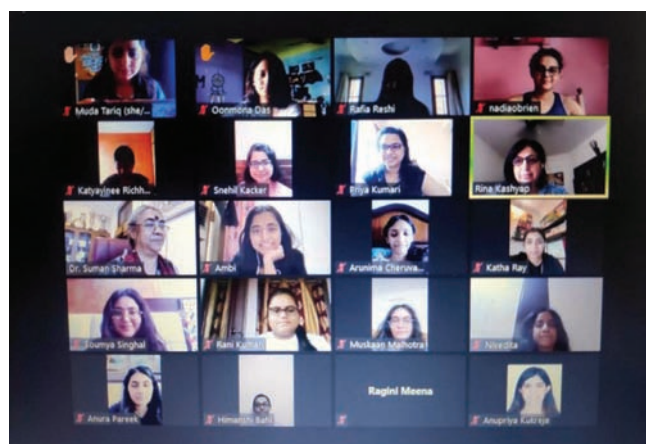
Important Activities at LSR

Important Activities at LSR

A talk on “Religion as the Source of Conflict Resolution” was delivered by Dr. Renu Bahl, former Associate Professor, LSR, on 4th March. She specializes in Indian Political Thought, Gandhi, Conflict Transformation, and Peace Building. Religion is mainly viewed as a cord of contention leading to wars and the rise of terrorism. However, Dr. Bahl talked about the legacy of religion, which is how it can help in conflict resolution through means such as inter-faith dialogue.

All activities including sports, jam sessions and special dinners have resumed in the Hostel with emphasis on Covid 19 safety protocols. The hostel library is functional. A nutritious yet tasty menu with lots of fruits, vegetables, salads and cooling drinks partly helps residents cope with the searing Delhi heat. The Residence Hall looks forward to exciting times with the new residents.



Office of International Programmes

From March 2021 to February 2022, due to the pandemic, LSR continued to function in virtual mode. All teaching-learning engagements were transacted through virtual mode as were all meetings and most administrative work. OIP remained in touch with partner Universities throughout to work on possibilities for online cooperation. Sciences Po offered a 2022 Summer School in both online and on-campus options which were open to all students of LSR. Students were encouraged to join the course. Fukuoka Women's University, Japan conducted their program online and sent the students their visa letters in March. Pragya Mishra, a third-year student from Philosophy Honors was selected for the LSR- Fukuoka Women's University Exchange Program, World of Japanese Contemporary Culture Program (WJC) for Fall 2021-Spring 2022. After completing her Fall 2022 semester in the online mode, Pragya joined the Spring 2022 semester at the Fukuoka University in the on-campus program. Vedika Pillai, who was nominated to Sciences Po had a rich experience on the campus and scored the highest grades in her first semester.

In March-April 2022, OIP invited applications for the LSR-NUS, LSR-Sciences Po, LSR Fukuoka Exchanges, LSR-Macquarie semester and Masters Exchange Programme. There was an overwhelming response from LSR students. Sneha Bisht from 2nd Year (Political

Science Honors), was selected for the yearlong exchange program with NUS, Chitragada Singh, of 3rd year (B.A Programme) was selected for Sciences Po and Sejal Choudhary of 3rd year (B.A Programme), was selected for Fukuoka Women's University. Tanya Mittal of 3rd year (History Honors) was selected for Macquarie University Fall Semester Exchange Programme 2022. Continuing with the earlier exchange practices, NUS nominated Ms. Radhika Suresh Gursahani under the Exchange Program for the July-December 2022 semester. We are looking forward to welcoming her to LSR in the coming semester.

Students of LSR were once again given the opportunity to apply for the Cargill Global Scholars Programme, a 2-year Leadership Development Programme which was open to only 10 select colleges and universities across India. It is a unique scholarship program that provides the students a platform for networking in a global forum. Around 20 students have applied for the scholarship this year.

On 25th February 2022, NUS invited LSR as an Overseas Partner University for the Asian Undergraduate Summit (AUS) 2022. In these uncertain times, exchange programs have opened to a hybrid world, giving students an opportunity to learn and contribute in a globalized world.



Placement Cell

The Placement Cell, Lady Shri Ram College for Women acts as an interface between the students and recruiters. From bringing a varied list of recruiters to organizing workshops, and seminars and bringing internship opportunities for the collective student body, the Placement Cell works throughout the year to bring onboard the best companies on campus. The Placement season of 2021-22 was unprecedented, with a never-before-seen rush for placements and companies vying for top slots on campus. There was the participation of around 130 companies to offer full-time positions. In all, over 230 offers were made to students in a variety of domains such as analytics, consulting, and finance. The number of offers increased by 20% as compared to last year's statistics, with the highest offer given to Avni Kainth from the Statistics Department at a whopping Rs. 40 lacs per annum.

The Placement Cell saw various students from different departments like English, History, Psychology, and Journalism being recruited by some of the top-rated companies in the industry. Industry giants like McKinsey & Co., Boston Consulting Group, Bain & Company, Kepler Cannon, Accenture, Dalberg, Trinity, Deloitte, EY, KPMG among others offered positions in a diverse range of fields such as consulting, finance, marketing and sales, media, and research as well as auditing. There were an exciting number of first-time recruiters at LSR such as PayTM, The Print and Garena to name a few. Educational organizations such as Teach for India also visited LSR to offer fellowship programs.

Apart from hosting companies such as Bank of America, LEK, RedSeer, DE Shaw, HUL for their internship programs and opening avenues for socially geared initiatives with organizations like Shashi Dream Foundation, CRRSS, CovEd India, the Cell continued to partner with ZS Associates and Deloitte GSM for their extremely prestigious all India case competition.

The Placement Cell also robustly organizes seminars and workshops to build on the overall development of the students, such as workshops for personal/case interviews, group discussions as well as sessions aimed at equipping students with skills of CV making. These workshops are conducted to help make the Placement Cell more conducive to career-building and training support, apart from working for just final placements and internships. Around 31 workshops were conducted this academic year. Apart from its external engagements, the Placement Cell also worked on constantly providing support to students through the assistance of the Placement Cell department representatives, the union members, and the faculty advisors, who worked tirelessly round the clock, especially since meetings and sessions were held completely online this year.

As per India Today rankings 2021, LSR bagged the first rank among colleges with the best placement record. A snapshot of the latest achievements can be seen in the table below. The cell continues to keep up the momentum and train the students for their healthy future.

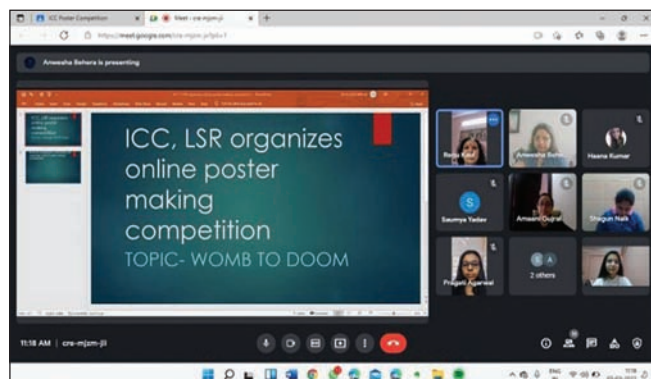


The Internal Complaints Committee

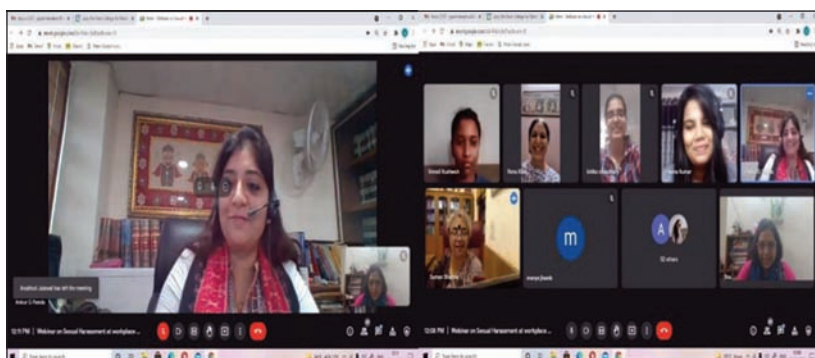

The session was an interactive one and the zoom webinar witnessed diverse questions from inquisitive young minds. Mrs. Ankur gave insights on the Vishaka Guidelines given by the Supreme Court and shed light on the importance of creating a gender-equitable society. She also shared her own experiences as a woman in the legal profession.

In her concluding remarks, Mrs. Ankur emphasized the importance of ‘conversations’ in our society. A dialogue is necessary to lead us toward the creation of an egalitarian society. More women should be visible in public spaces and acquire powerful positions.



An extempore poster-making competition was conducted on 5th March 2022 in collaboration with IQAC on the theme ‘Her Story’. The topic “FROM WOMB TO DOOM” was given on the spot. Students made impeccable posters depicting the journey of a woman from her birth to death. Shagun Naik, from the Department of Psychology got the First position. On the occasion of International Women’s Day, 8th March 2022, ICC invited Mrs. Meera Chhiber, Advocate, Delhi High Court, as a speaker for a joint session with the North East Cell of LSR to speak on “Gender-Based Violence during COVID-19 Pandemic”. The session was deeply engaging and sensitized the LSR fraternity on how to prevent and respond to such situations. The speaker threw light on real-time situations and the talk was well attended. The faculty advisors discussed the steps needed to be taken in college to create more awareness in this area.



North East Cell

The North East Cell seeks to provide a safe space to discuss and share members' experiences and encourages them to explore and express themselves. This was an eventful year with several firsts for the cell. A set of student coordinators and core teams were formed. Guest speakers, student participation in inter and intra-college events, and in-house discussions occurred regularly. The in-house discussions were aimed at building a greater sense of belonging among the members and provided space for authentic self-expression. The issues discussed included personal experiences people encounter followed by a discussion of actions/reactions thereof. The speakers shared their own experiences and emphasized required skills on the part of students, the nature and demands of pursuing higher studies, and covered details of the Chevening scholarship and the prospects of getting the scholarship.

The cell also conducted a series of interactions under the theme "The Stalwarts of North East India" with eminent personalities who have enormously contributed to society in different fields. It was intended to inspire students to think creatively and commit themselves to bring desired transformations in society. The details of the interaction are as follows:

Extra Curricular Activities

The Student Union

The Student Union which was elected on 16th April 2021, took charge during the online mode and undertook multiple student initiatives, and navigated from online to the offline mode in the month of February 2022. In the year 2021-22, Enactus LSR won the 'Race to Rethink Plastic' category of the Enactus: 77 Film Festival 2021 and was awarded a cash prize of \$2,500 USD at the Enactus World Cup 2021. The Race to Rethink Plastic tackles the plastic waste crisis through entrepreneurial action. The race saw participation from more than 176 entries worldwide including teams from Canada, Brazil, Egypt, and Germany. Project Utthaan was the winner of the category which witnessed judging by a diverse and distinguished panel of judges followed by public voting.

Enactus LSR in its endeavor to make business ethics an essential part of its values qualified for the KPMG Business Ethics Grant 2021 for the flagship project, Project Ruhani, and was awarded a cash prize of Rs. 50,000 for the same.

Enactus LSR was among the top 8 teams in the Enactus India National Competition 2021 where over 75 colleges participated and presented their business models for a sustainable future. LSR presented Project Utthaan, a project that began in 2017 with the goal of uplifting nursery communities by equipping them with the skill of vertical gardening, and Project Ruhani, an initiative that believes holistic education has the power to change millions of lives and consequently, the face of a country.

Prakriti

The pandemic did not dampen the efforts to engage, enlighten and educate the students on the need for environmental protection. Prakriti society started

with weekly environmental news and bi-monthly environmental quizzes on its social media handle in 2021 to make the members more aware of events around them and the urgency to swing to action to protect planet Earth. In 2021, Prakriti organised a 'Climate Change Series' that saw students coming to the forefront to contribute their bit to the environment. The students at Prakriti Society in October- November 2021, took up the novel task of unsubscribing and deleting emails to massively reduce their carbon footprint. Moreover, students projecting themselves as Green Warriors also took to following the 4Rs in relation to the theme of Sustainable Fashion. For example, students undertook to repurpose old sarees to make mats, use old t-shirts to cover cardboard boxes and turn them into organisers, revamp old canvas shoes and turn leftovers from stitching to scrunchies. Prakriti took up the theme of 'Taking a Step for Our Planet' by encouraging members to use brown papers received through Amazon, Flipkart packaging for rough work, sitting in the garden during daytime for attending online classes, and using solar lanterns.

Prakriti started in 2022 with the aim of furthering its engagement. The society representatives sent a New Year package to all the members of the society and staff advisors to take a New Year pledge to engage in environmental conservation. The package also included some measures for environmental conservation along with information regarding the dire state of our planet. The society started the bi-monthly series 'Darpan' in January 2022 with the purpose of engaging the members on green issues, monthly series 'Bites' in January 2022 that covers the important environmental dates of the particular month, important environmental happenings of that month, suggestions as to what individuals can do for environmental protection, contributions made by Prakriti members for that particular month and 'Healthy Tuesdays' in February 2022. The society also started a bi-monthly series 'Prakriti Recommends' that is a compilation of the movies, and documentaries on the environment. Moreover, to encourage members, Prakriti also had 'Best member of the month.' Prakriti members as part of task groups undertook initiatives such as planting

saplings, watering plants, composting kitchen waste, feeding birds, segregating waste, using cloth bags, making DIY aloe vera soap, DIY tint for face and DIY Moisturizer, growing fruits and vegetables at home, using brown papers, reusing pamphlets, using leftover products from art class or workshops along with other waste such as broken bricks to create decor pieces using solar lanterns and making bird's nests.

Several sessions were conducted and are described below.

• Aravalli Biodiversity Park Virtual Tour

Prakriti in collaboration with the Aravalli Biodiversity Park conducted a Virtual Nature Walkthrough Aravalli's undulating natural heritage on 25th September 2021. Spread over 699 acres, the Aravalli Biodiversity Park is a concerted effort to rejuvenate Delhi's lost biodiversity owing to mining and invasive species.

• Virtual Jungle Tour

Prakriti organized a "Virtual Jungle Safari" in collaboration with Dudhwa Tiger Reserve on Zoom. The speakers of this insightful session were Mr. Vikrant Nath and Ms. Deepti.

• Session with Healing Himalayas

Prakriti organised a virtual event "Healing Himalayas" dated 18th November 2021. The session began with Mr. Pradeep sharing how he started a project in Kenar and moving down to Lahaul where he faced many challenges in terms of carbon emission and waste management. The event also covered severe issues of solid waste management faced by both rural and urban areas.

• Scope of Green Entrepreneurship in India

Climate change and its impending risk have brought forward new inventions and solutions. The session on green entrepreneurship was conducted on October 21, 2022. The session was an enriching and insightful one with the innovative topic of blockchain-based carbon trading. It raised awareness about the scope of the environmental industry.

• Canva Workshop

On 13th January 2022, Prakriti organised a Canva Workshop, "Canva 101: Getting Started," led by Barsha Das, the Head of Design of the Prakriti Society, to help participants learn how to make attractive invitations, engaging Instagram posts, and mesmerising posters. The interactive workshop saw the participation of over 60 students.

• Climate Change and Indian Cities

Prakriti held a talk with Dr. Priyadarshini Karve, an alumnus of the University of Pune, on the 5th of February 2022 through Google Meet. The event was attended by more than 60 students. The event began with Dr. Karve speaking on climate change in general and then moving on to carbon footprints.

• Climate Justice Library Visit

- On 21st April 2022 Prakriti Society members under the guidance of their President visited the first climate justice library in Delhi.
- On 12th April 2022 at Umang'22 Prakriti society put up stalls for the environmental quiz, dumb charades, and plantation drive. We got 6,671 emails deleted from the visitors to our stalls and got 53 people to plant.

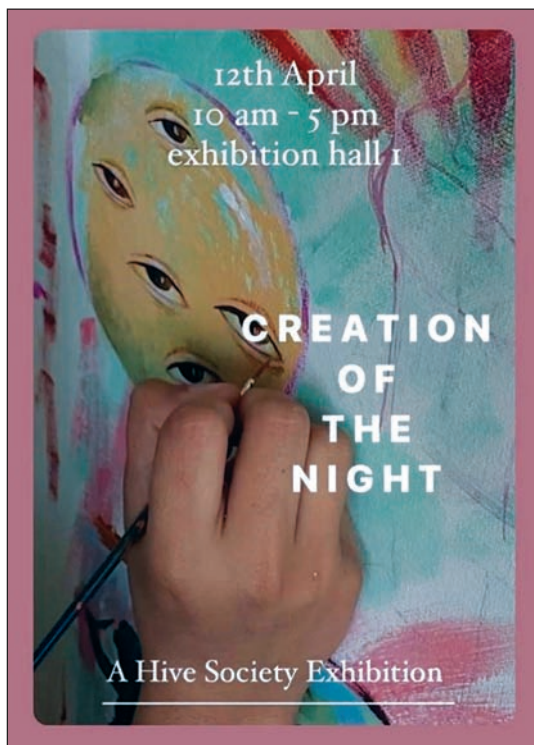

Dance Society

Dancing with the feet is one thing but dancing with the heart is another and the LSR Dance Society, believes in doing just that. The Orientation for this year was held online, on 14th January. The auditions were held across 2 weeks, from 17th January to 4th February, 2022.

Western Wing

In the academic year of 2021-22, the Western wing trained in styles like hip-hop and dancehall under various choreographers. Pieces that were taught in the previous year by choreographers Gaurav Rawat (hip-hop) and Sushma Shetty (whacking-semi-classical fusion), which unfortunately could not be staged, were instead polished and performed this year. Additionally, new pieces were added by choreographers Tanshul Thakur and Hardik Bhutani in the 2022 production.



With the help of society seniors, the members trained in Bhangra as well. A majority of the production of this year was created online, in light of the pandemic. Upon returning to the campus the team converted an online production to a stage performance and trained the newly inducted first years. The whole team put up the final annual production on 12th April for Umang, LSR's cultural event.

Choreography Wing

The Choreography wing began the year by training themselves in the basics of Ballet and Jazz and continued their training for the majority of the online part of the year. Upon moving back to an offline mode of operation, the team began training the new members



of the society, and with a shortened fest season, decided to properly stage its previous year's online thematic production (2020-21), Lilith.

Lilith, sheds a light on the first woman that God had created alongside Adam. But upon her denial to be subservient, Lilith was banished and cursed away from the garden of Eden and demonized. The production portrays the pain that Lilith suffers through intricate choreography and heartfelt emotion. The pieces were choreographed by Eden Dolreich Pereira as well as the team members themselves. The production bagged the First position at Mood Indigo (IIT Bombay; online) and in Mudra (NSUT; offline) Lastly, the team staged its performance on the home stage during Umang '22.

Classical Wing

The Classical wing presented its Annual Production at Umang. The production comprised a unique combination of hand gestures, footwork, expressions and body movements, portrayed through the dance forms of Kathak, Bharatanatyam, Mohiniyattam and Odissi. The entire production was choreographed by the team members themselves. Across the academic year, the members also participated and performed well in solo dance competitions held at colleges across Delhi and beyond. Muskan Sahu bagged the Third prize in the MI The Best Solo Dance Competition and Soumya Nandal won the Second prize in the MDI Gurgaon Solo Dance Competition. As a way of bidding goodbye to the senior most members of the society and compensating for lost opportunities in the pandemic, the society also decided to put up a performance created and executed entirely by the final year members. The performance, aptly titled "One Last Time" was performed as a part of Umang '22.



Saaz, The Instrumental Society

Despite the pandemic, Saaz remained a very active space. During the lockdown, the society conducted virtual practice sessions and focused on expanding online presence. Further the society organized a virtual orientation on 12th December, 2021. Saaz hosted three rounds of live virtual auditions. The rounds were conducted on 19th, 21st and 25th December, 2021. Saaz also opened their first offline intra-college event, Umang '22 performing a fusion (Indian and Western Classical) orchestral piece, Aaghaaz.

The Western Music Society

The Western Music Society is recognized as one of the pre-eminent teams of the Delhi University western music circuit. The group is known for introducing complex technicalities and genres such as western, classical, jazz, gospel and R&B among several other genres in competitive and non-competitive levels. The society has experimented with different styles and has brought all these into the annual arrangement.

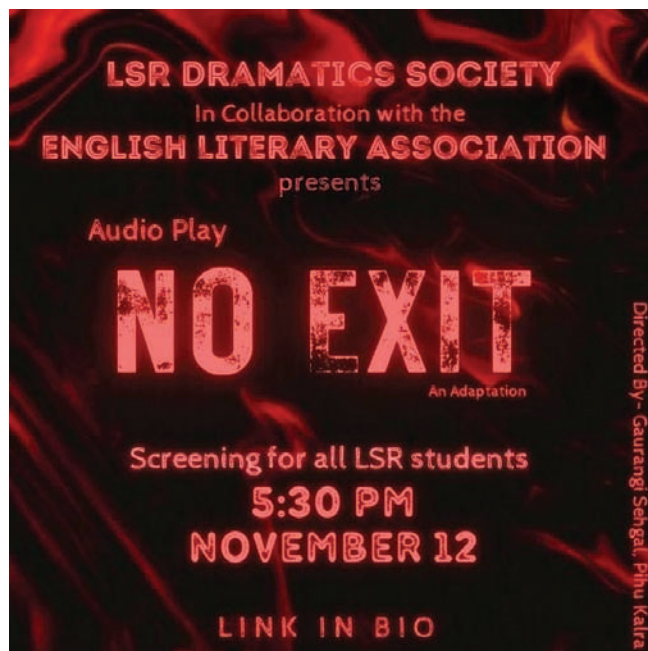

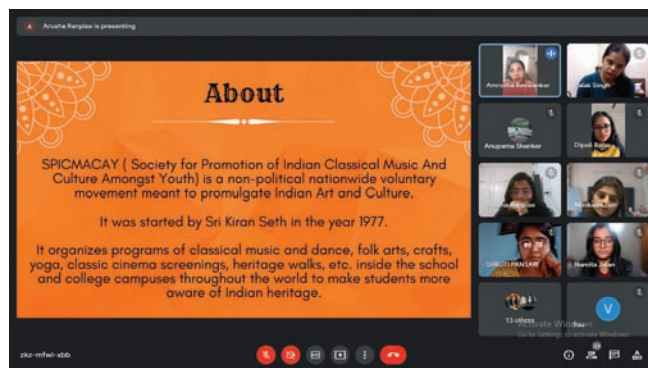
exploring multiple forms of theater inside and outside the society.

The SPIC MACAY, LSR Chapter intends to enrich the quality of formal education by increasing awareness about different aspects of Indian heritage and inspiring young minds to imbibe the values embedded in it. The SPIC MACAY Orientation took place on 8th December 2021 and was attended by over 150 students. The session proceeded with a brief introduction of SPIC MACAY, the hierarchical structure of the organization, interactive games, *Virasat*, and a recap of the previous year's events.

To celebrate the 73rd Republic Day, online contests for poster making and poetry/storytelling competitions on the theme "Swaraj: then and now" were organized. With the immense strength of their pens, Ayushi Sinha (LSR), Riya (LSR), and Shradha Saini (Motilal Nehru) in poetry/storytelling and Jasmin Kaun Sabharwal (Deshbandhu), Ritika Srivastava (Ramanujan) and Kashish Aggarwal (Deshbandhu) in poster-making emerged as the winners.

On January 27, 2022, an online panel discussion was organized on 'Changing Course and Transforming Education'. The esteemed speakers were Dr. Sunil Sondhi, Project Director, Culture and Communication Project, IGNC, Dr. Yaaminey Mubayi, an eminent Social Development professional, Historian and Cultural



Heritage specialist and Dr. Sushma Jatoo, Head of Department of the Kalakosa Division of IGNC. The turnout of the event was substantial with almost 100 members. The first speaker, Dr. Sunil explained the ideas of Aristotle and Einstein on the binary relationship of culture and education with the schooling of scriptures. He also stated how the dynamics of foreign countries and India differs vastly. Dr. Yaaminey shared insights on how history has been reconstructed over time.

A moving soft board event called 'Dastan-e-Dilli' was organized on 29th and 30th March in college, where students were asked to write their favorite Delhi experiences under the tagline 'Tape your Delhi tale'. The event was a huge success where students turned up in great numbers on both days to write about their memories that make them feel at home in Delhi.

English Debating Society

The English Debating Society is an open society and accepts all students who wish to be a part of it, thus valuing genuine interest over prior knowledge or skill. It trains new members, organizes a variety of sessions, competes in tournaments and organizes the LSR Annual Parliamentary Debate. The formal orientation for the new batch took place on 2nd January 2022 and featured two

exhibition debates by senior members. This was followed by the recruitment process done through Google forms with prompts for critical thinking and a short speaking task, after which approximately 150 new members were inducted into the society.

The training sessions began soon after induction, with new members being taught about the Asian Parliamentary and British Parliamentary forms of debate. The topics that were covered included formats, rules of procedure, motions, speaker roles, speech format and content, adjudication and argumentation

among others. After the training sessions, regular mock debates were organized and adjudicated by senior members for the new students. Case preparation sessions were also organized to help new members understand case construction and argumentation. Two sensitization sessions were held for the new members facilitated by Vibha Swaminathan and Saniya Rizwan.

As a means of expanding the activities of the society beyond competitive debating, the initiative of Reading Circle sessions was introduced. These sessions were open to all students of LSR to encourage critical thinking, intellectual engagement and meaningful conversations over historical and contemporary issues. The six such sessions organized received enormous participation.

The annual LSR Parliamentary Debate was organized from 15-17 April, 2022 in the online format. Witnessing the enthusiastic participation of 32 teams and over 45 adjudicators, the tournament consisted of five in-rounds, a quarterfinal round, a semifinal round and culminated in the Grand Finals. The tournament had internationally acclaimed debaters on the Core Adjudication Panel and featured motions on the themes of academia, arts, economics, census, climate change, law, ethics and philosophy. The winning team was a Cross consisting of Gunjan Saini, Anjana Pillai and Prarthna Jhavar and the Best Adjudicator was Vaibhav Kumar. The following prizes were won:

issues. A panel discussion was held on 5th October to understand the intricacies of the crisis in Afghanistan with specific focus on women. The theme was 'State of Women in Afghanistan under the Taliban Rule'. Out of the three speakers, Bilquees Daud, Akanksha Khullar and Sveto Md. Ishoq, two are Aghani nationals who could share their experience and ground reality. A highly engaging MELA quiz was conducted on 16th-17th November in collaboration with the Quiz Society for college students. There were 2 rounds in the quiz with multiple stages in each round. The themes were music,

entertainment, literature and arts (MELA Quiz). A Research Paper Writing Workshop was conducted on 27th January 2022 to discuss the basics of writing and publishing social science research papers. The World University Service

The 'World University Service' Society provides a space for all those who wish to work for the betterment of society, in whatever way they can. It was instituted as a non-performing arts society in 2004. Since then, it has aimed to spread awareness on a variety of issues, focusing largely on physical as well as psychological health. This year WUS organized a workshop on 'World Rose Day' in collaboration with ICS and NSS. World Rose Day is celebrated on 22nd September each year in dedication to the welfare of cancer patients. An interesting event organized by WUS was 'Tools to



Thrive: Expressive Arts Therapy' to raise awareness about Mental Health and introduce the importance of Expressive arts to combat stress. A 'Financial Literacy and Investment Awareness' session was conducted to help students understand the basics of financial literacy and to promote savings and financial security. In addition, a skill enhancement session on 'Public and Debating Skills' was held to help students polish their oratory techniques. A 'Sustainability Thinking' workshop was organized to create awareness within the student community regarding sustainability and help them evaluate their personal footprint on the environment. The students were involved in various interactive activities and case studies. A video based on sustainability and climate change was screened on April 13th, which was followed by a discussion. Alongside these events, WUS organized many team building activities. During Umang 22, the WUS stall focused on health awareness by engaging people in activities that could combat stress and promote individual physical

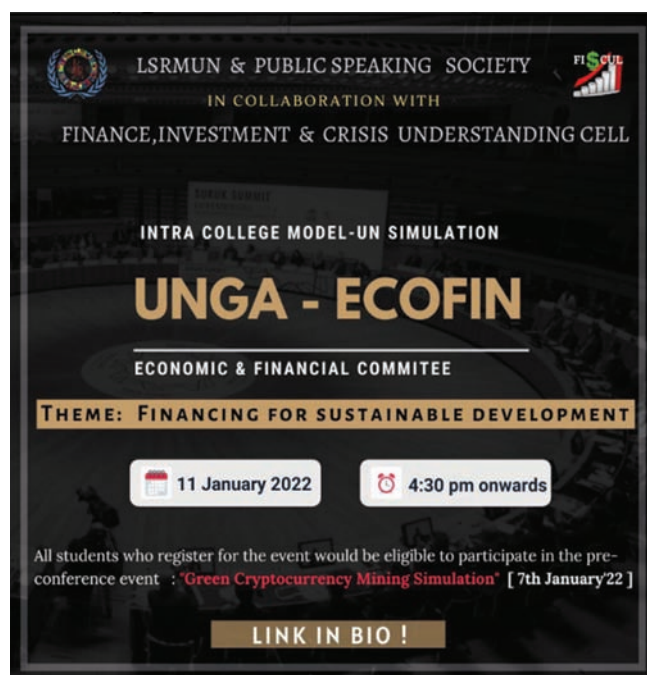

Model United Nations and Public Speaking Society

LSR Model United Nations and Public Speaking Society is an avenue for students passionate about international relations and debate to come together and hone their skills in creative thinking, research and argumentation. This year, the focus was on the intersection of three areas: Inclusivity, Capacity Building and Diplomacy.

The society adopted a year-round inclusivity mission. With the spirit of eliminating exclusionary jargon, the society pivoted to end-to-end bilingual communication. Furthermore, the society hosted Asia's first-ever multilingual and free of cost conference, breaking financial and linguistic barriers to participation in MUNs. Owing to the online mode, the team also redesigned a cyber equity policy and instituted an Equity Cell to increase transparency and inclusion throughout the conference. The tradition of promoting public speaking for students belonging to disadvantaged backgrounds was continued through the simulation of the NGO Committee and a donation drive in collaboration with KHUSHII and MIMA NGOs.

The society made capacity building and training the central focus of the year. Overall, there was a three-fold increase in the number of capacity building initiatives including but not limited to pioneering LSR's first MUN training bootcamp, three intra-college simulations, and the establishment of the MUN Training Team. As a result of these initiatives, the society achieved an 11-fold boost in its annual win rate, with over 15 maiden wins and a Best Institutional Delegation title at AMIMUN, Asia's largest Model UN Conference.



With its efforts to promote diplomacy and negotiation, the society successfully organized its annual Model UN Conference - LSR MUN 2022. With its theme as Building Back Better, it simulated 7 committees in collaboration with the United Nations Development Programme, United Nations Information Center for India and Bhutan and United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.



Extra Curricular Activities

The conference hosted over 20 Institutional Delegations, witnessing a four-fold increase since its previous conference and received over 1500 delegate registrations. The conference was featured by some leading media forums including DU Official, Amar Ujala and DU Beat.

The society upheld the spirit of knowledge sharing and released several publications over the past year. Two

society newsletters were released on the themes of 'Protection of Human Rights in Conflict Zones' as well as 'Dissent'. Furthermore, the conference newsletters focused on our theme of 'Building Back Better'. The society also increased its synergies by collaborating with other societies such as GAEE LSR, Expressions, Projekt, FISCUL (Department of Economics) to organize inter-college competitions, intra-college simulations and reading circles.

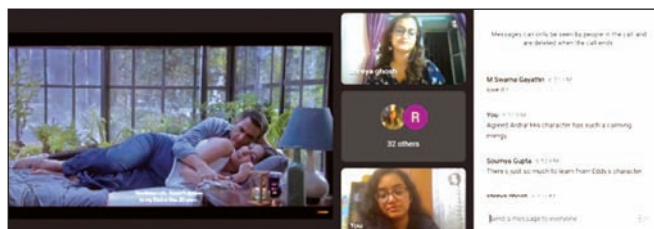

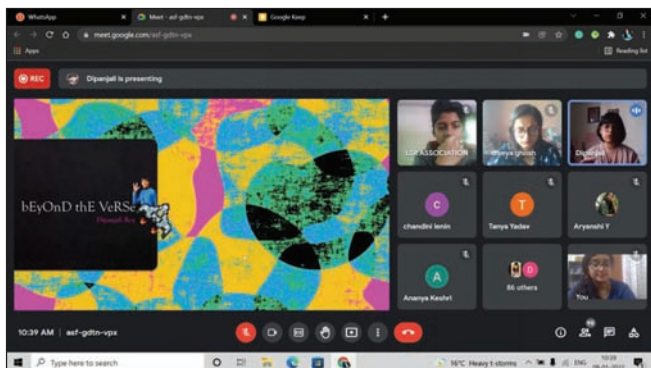
Expressions

Expressions, the English creative writing society of LSR is a safe and warm space for writers, poets and everyone else who wishes to indulge in regular and varied forms of creative expression. Expressions started the academic year by organizing a poetry workshop that helped re-introduce the society to the second- and third-year students on 14th August 2021. A creative writing

competition was organized in September 2021 by the name of 'Scrabble' where students from college participated enthusiastically. The winners were Shikha Chandra, Anushka Dhyani, Swarnim Agrawal, Maalavika A., Kritika Singh and Medha Sinha. Expressions organized 'Mind Swap' in the third week of October 2021. Members of the core team were paired together with the purpose of not only getting to know each other, but also writing a piece in the style of their partner. Pieces were then discussed in feedback sessions spanned over three days. A short film screening of *Call Him Eddy* was organized on 22nd October 2021 which witnessed enthusiastic participation.



Extra Curricular Activities



Expressions organized an Open Mic with the theme “Unwinding the Untold” where the participants showcased their diverse talents on 13th November 2021. On 8th January 2022, in collaboration with the English Department, Expressions invited Dipanjali Roy, an alumna of the college and the recipient of QMUL Wasafiri New Writing Prize for Poetry and other awards, for a poetry workshop.

The Because You Matter Campaign collaborated with Expressions to organize an Open Mic on the theme of self-love and hope on 28th January 2022.

An online short story workshop was organized by Expressions on 2nd April 2022, which touched upon the key elements and important tips for writing short fiction. Expressions, in collaboration with Abhivyakti, translated and adapted *Kari* by Amruta Patil into a bilingual poetry drama. The production was staged during Umang ‘22. Expressions also collaborated with the Philosophy Department for an Open Mic which was a part of their annual department fest. The Open Mic was on the theme ‘Art and Culture’ and was held on 23rd April 2022. In the month of April, members of Expressions participated in the National Poetry Writing Month by sharing poetry prompts and writing one poem every day. This was featured on social media.

Every month (from October 2021 to April 2022), a panel of judges was formed that included three volunteers from the core team and the two coordinators that judged the entries of this monthly competition. The Society received entries from Expression’s members (Open Society and Core Team). The winner was featured on Instagram, LinkedIn and in the annual publication. This time, diverse themes were included in *Expresso*: The

Places We Carry (observing the places that matter to us significantly), Conversations (writings on human connections formed through language and conversations), Up Where We Belong (exploring our existence in the vastness of the universe), and Mirror, Mirror on the Wall (tracking the ever-changing nature of humans). There was also space for non-themed creative pieces. This time, artwork and photographs from the core team members were accepted. Also, there was a dedicated space for the ‘Writer of the Month’ winning entries.

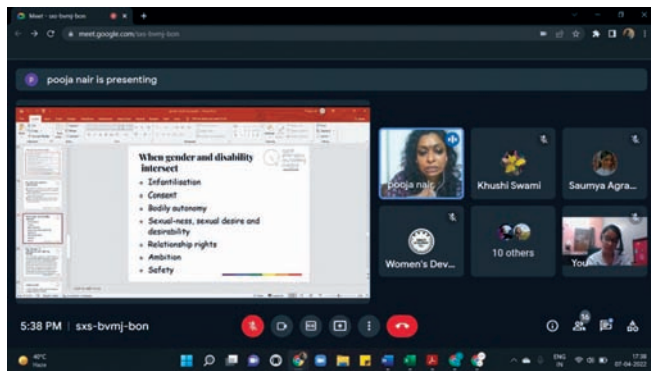


With regard to social media, every week, the Expressions family posted a new non-themed piece of writing on its Instagram stories, giving emerging writers a platform to showcase their work. Writing advice by famous writers and tips on writing were posted frequently on the Instagram feed. Selected pieces were designed and posted on social media to feature pieces written by the members of Expressions. This was followed by weekly prompts sent on Open Society groups and the NaPoWriMo season.

REACH

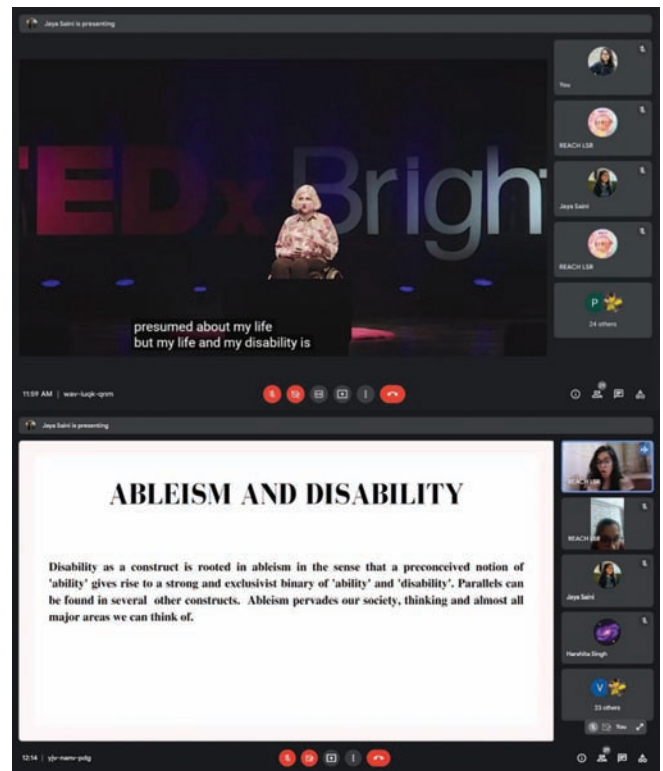
REACH, The Equal Opportunity Cell of LSR, held its virtual orientation session on 27th August 2021 to familiarize students with the Cell. The session convened with an overview of REACH, its coordinators, and staff adviser and went on to discuss REACH's functioning, recruitment process, agenda for the year, and expectations from volunteers.

REACH conducted collaborative events throughout the year. In collaboration with the Department of Psychology, it organized a session on 'Neurodivergence' on 19th January 2022. The talk was conducted by Ms. Amalina Kohli Dave, a mental health activist who works to advocate queer/crip approaches to mental health and has been instrumental in organizing spaces for people with invisible disabilities. On 18th April 2022, a session was organized in collaboration with the Sociology Department on 'Disability and Capitalism'. The session was begun by Professor Gopa who expressed her happiness over



having LSR's own alumnus Dr. Vandana Chaudhry as the guest speaker for the session. Some of the matters focused upon during the session were how disability is inextricably interconnected with ability, the ideology of ability and its interconnection with capitalism. On 7th April 2022, a lecture on the theme 'Gender, Disability, and the Psyche' was organized in collaboration with WDC. The speaker of the event was Pooja Nair, an independent therapist.

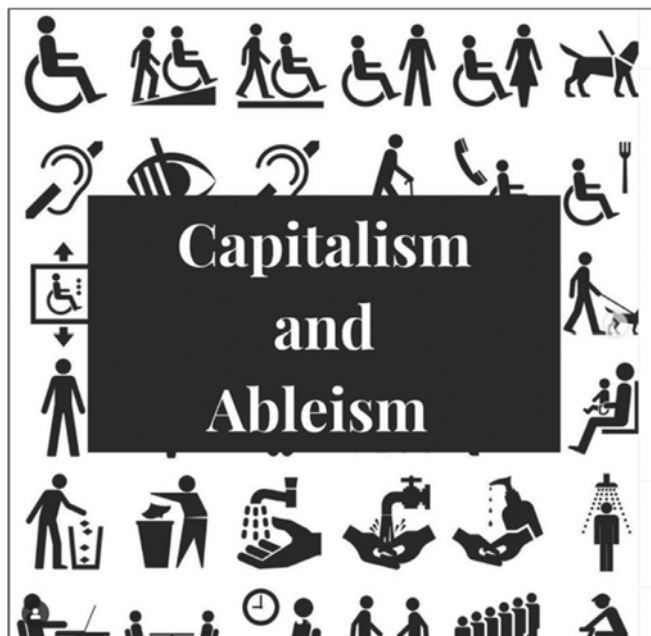
Important takeaways were the notions of infantilization, patronizing attitudes from society, consent being seen



as irrelevant and relationship rights. Further on 8th April REACH in collaboration with the English Literary Association conducted an interactive talk on 'Literature and Ableism' by Dr. Hemachandran Karah. Dr. Karah teaches English Literature at the Humanities and Social Sciences Department, IIT Madras. His interest lies in researching on disability, health, the language question, literary criticism, and musicology.

REACH, in collaboration with DEBSOC, held a reading session of the book "Laziness Does Not Exist" by Davon Price. The session was part of REACH's sensitization and awareness series around disability. The book discusses the ableist roots of hustling, productivity, and work-dependent self-worth in its protest against the "laziness" trope inflicted on those outside the norm of capitalism.

REACH discussed "Em and the Big Hoom" by Jerry Pinto tracing the journey of Pinto as he narrates tales of family, motherhood, psychosis, and disability. Collaborating with the student body, the REACH Core



team, and other societies, the Literary and Reporting Team produced a newsletter.

The coordinators constantly held informal conversations with the students with disabilities in college to document their experience of the COVID-19 induced online education, and offline transitioning

Other events/developments included ‘The Outside Gaze: Societal perceptions of Disability’ and sensitization sessions by reaching out to the Debating society, NSS and Enactus.

The “Buddy Group” was opened to all students across the college who identified with the experience of disability without diagnostic and documentation requirements. While all administrative procedures that

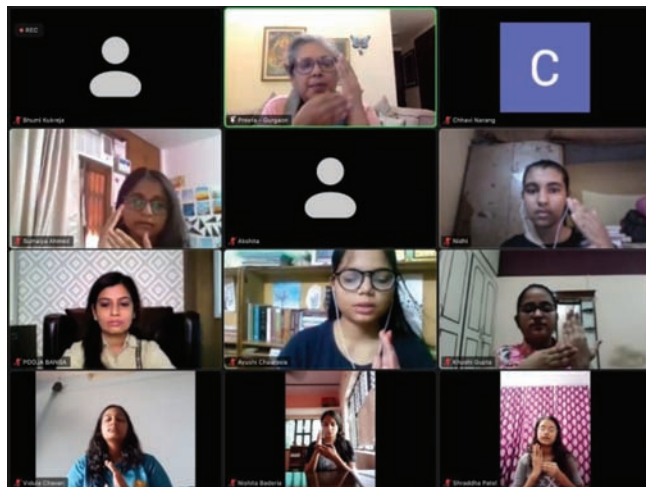
have to be separately followed for PWD students in college were followed, the Buddies group also went beyond to become a wider interaction. REACH introduced an “Opportunity Desk” or a common information bulletin for all opportunities, sessions, events, and lectures that are relevant to the context of disability and REACH. Accessibility issues were taken up including infrastructural difficulties faced, the navigation of hostel facilities, the requirement of scribes, and the technical glitches with respect to Open Book examination and result declaration. The Resource Team completed two departments’ drives [History and Political Science] to ensure the availability of accessible study material. Through Social Media, REACH introduced an engaging concept of “Disability Dictionary” where the cell members broke down the meanings of many terms and redefined them through the disability justice paradigm. They used the platform to create a LinkedIn account for REACH and created a logo for 2021-22.



VAPP

The Voluntary Agency Placement Programme (VAPP) provides a safe space for students to engage with various socio-economic issues and thought-provoking discussions, opportunities to volunteer and intern with NGOs to explore the possibilities of alternate careers in the development sector. VAPP began its activities in 2021-22 with a session on 'Emotional Freedom Technique' in collaboration with the Offbeat Support Foundation on 30th September 2021, where trainer, Ms. Preeta Pradhan demonstrated the use of fingertips to stimulate energy points in the body. VAPP organized a virtual field trip on 23rd November 2021 to Udayan Care NGO which aimed at taking a glimpse into the lives of girls who have been enabled to achieve success through Udayan Care's flagship programme - Udayan Shalini Fellowship. The second event on 15th of January, 2022 was a session on 'Women in Civil Services Then v/s Now' with Ms. Garima Panwar, I.A.S, Assistant Commissioner Office, Bidar and Ms. Ira Singhal, I.A.S, Deputy Commissioner, Revenue Department. The session started with the journeys of the speakers, the challenges women faced earlier and how these challenges have changed over the time considering the pandemic.

VAPP also conducted an informative session on 'Gandhi Fellowship' in collaboration with the Gandhi Fellowship Program. Gandhi Fellowship is a 2-year full time transformational youth leadership program offered by Piramal Foundation. It was held on 20th January 2022. On 15th February 2022 there was a session on 'Special Education in India' with Ms. Riya Rastogi, a special educator. VAPP released various editions of monthly magazine "PULSE" and the newsletter "INSIGHT" on the social development sector covering a variety of issues. VAPP has also circulated 25 internship and



volunteering opportunities with the student body in the development and social sector providing them a chance to explore alternate careers. In Environment week, VAPP decorated its soft-board on the topic "Eco-Warriors of India".

VAPP took the initiative of thanking the gardeners of LSR for their immense hard work and contribution, collecting thank you messages for gardeners from the student body to hang on trees. In Umang 2022, VAPP had put up HASTHKALA the embroidery workshop stall wherein coordinators taught basic embroidery designs to participants. This was aimed at revival of the lost art of embroidery. The session ended with a mellifluous evening, in collaboration with Dhvani, the Indian Music Society of LSR. The rejuvenating musical session "RAAG" was held on 14th April 2022 in collaboration with Rhythm of Life, an NGO working with underprivileged children with the aim of nurturing them into confident independent adults through a specially designed curriculum ABC (Activities Based Curriculum).



DHYANA

Dhyana as a society for consciousness and awareness has been consistently working on releasing monthly themes on various topics. These themes have been a major contribution by the members of the society as well as students from different departments. The entries were collected in the form of poems, articles, prose, artwork, photographs and the personal experiences of people. These covered areas like youth dilemmas and their aspirations, body neutrality, breaking stigmas and various dimensions of life. These monthly themes helped in providing students from all the departments with an opportunity to showcase their talents, potentials and creativity. It made their work reach a larger audience, thereby, increasing the reach of the society as a whole. Among the events conducted, the formal orientation happened on 26th August 2021. The main highlight of the orientation was the announcement of Dhyana turning into an open society which was followed



by a query and doubt session with students. There was also an informal event 'Meet me in the Meet' on 30th September 2021. The theme was "Pink Flamingo Delights". Fun activities like "Pitch me the Number" and "Build a Story" and calming guided imagery meditation made the event interactive. Finally, there was a talk by Ms. Saumya Mathur, Alumna of LSR, founder of Dhyana, a trained psychotherapist and a Yoga instructor. She spoke on 'Calming Anxiety: Practical Skills for Everyday' on 30th October 2021. It was an insightful session wherein the audience learned about anxiety and its management. The session focussed on the speaker explaining the meaning of anxiety and how it is a natural reaction to any external situation or internal conflict that is usually rooted in our future apprehensions but becomes a disorder if it persists or interferes with our lives for a longer duration.



Women's Development Cell

Established in 1985, WDC has earned the reputation of being a liberal space with a voracious appetite for conversations that empower the existential core. WDC finds its true power in initiating conversations on everything from the pressing social issues of domestic violence, oppressive intimate relationships, sexual harassment to the psychological and spiritual issues of self-discovery, uninformed compliance, the power structures of patriarchy and the like. Guest lectures, book readings, slam poetry performances, movie screenings and "Let's Talk" sessions are all tools regularly employed in an effort to reverse the whims of the centuries.

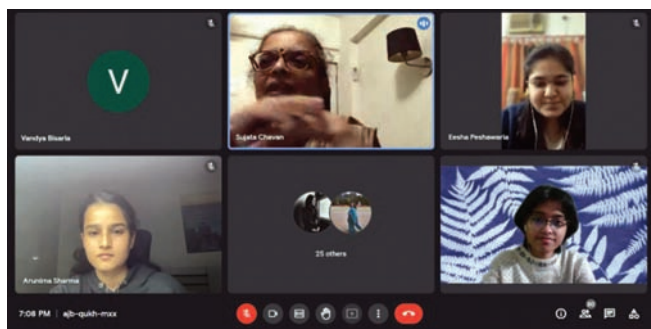
The WDC organized a panel discussion with the SC/ST Cell, LSR on 26th August, 2021. The theme was 'Dalit Feminism in the Contemporary Age' and the speakers for the event were Ms. Cynthia Stephen and Dr. Sowjanya Tamalapakula. The session helped explore the intersectionality of oppression by looking at the conceptual frameworks provided by Dalit Feminism. On 19th September, 2021, the reading and analysis of Lihaaf by Ismat Chughtai was organized. A session called 'Understanding What We Do' was held on 12th January, 2022 with Devanshi Ranjan, Ayushi Mahajan, Jasmin Naur Hafiz, Medha Prakash and Rida Kulsum. The aim of the talk was to acquaint WDC members with the basic



ideas and themes that the cell concerns itself with, and how they play out in our lives and in college spaces. A panel discussion was held with Dr. Sujata Chavan and Ms. Haseena Khan on 15th February, 2022. The topic was 'Understanding the Implications of Increasing Women's Marriageable Age.' The multifacetedness of the Supreme Court's decision to increase the marriageable age of women was explored through insights from people who are well-acquainted with the Indian landscape on the ground.

On the occasion of International Women's Day (8th March, 2022) WDC had an exhibition on the theme of 'BreakTheBias' and a panel discussion on 'Women in LSR' with Dr Megha Dhillon, Ms Nancy Pathak, Dr Maitreyee Mandal and Dr. Suman Bhanoo.

Further a lecture with REACH, LSR was held on 7th April, 2022 addressing the theme 'Disability, Gender & Psyche.' The speaker was Ms. Pooja Nair. Members of WDC (Anjika, Adya, Eesha, Tanveen, Rida, Satabdi and Shrishti) participated in the Global Intercultural Dialogue on 6th November, 2021 organized by the University of Brescia. The event saw participation of over 80 students and faculty members from institutions across USA, UK, Canada, Korea, Japan, China, Vietnam, Bahrain, Italy and LSR from India.
