Action taken Report on Feedback provided by Students (202-23)

<p>More sessions on career planning should be taken</p>	<p>As per feedback of students, several sessions on career counseling were organised. For example English department organised a session with Swati Daftuar (Editor at Harper Collins India) (7/10/22) who talked about the field of editing, publishing and writing and the career prospects in the same.</p> <p>In a bid to enlighten the student about the nitty gritty of cracking internships, the Internship Series 2022- 23 was organised by the Mathematics department. The first episode on 20th October 2022 was on the topic- 'Securing the Blackrock Summer Internship.' The speakers of the session were Ms. Vartika Bharadwaj and Ms. Udit Arya from the Batch of 2023; both of them have been summer interns for BlackRock. The second session under the Internship Series 2023 was on the topic The Art of CV Building on 24th January, 2023. The speakers for the session were Ms. Paridhi Sharma and Ms. Chalsi Garg from the Batch of 2023 who are both placed at reputed companies. The third episode was held on the topic, 'Actuary as a Career' on 25th January, 2023. The guest speaker for the session was Ms. Khyati Arora from Batch of 2023.</p>
<p>More courses and workshops should be conducted on research methodology skills</p>	<p>Several sessions were held to increase student research skills. For example, In January 2023, a session on basics of primary research was organised by the Mentored Research Forum, a departmental club of Economics. It was taken by Ronak Jain, a researcher at Harvard University and was attended by 35 students. In March, speaker sessions organised by the Mentored Research Forum as part of its Research Week included a session on Research and Postgraduate Studies Abroad by Shivani Pandey. There was a three-part lecture series on key aspects of academic writing and research practices by the History department. Dr. Vijayant Kumar Singh spoke on Citation Techniques and Formatting a Research Paper (1st March 2023). Dr. Vasudha Pande addressed Basics of Research Methodologies and Framing a Question for Research (2nd March, 2023). Dr. Pankaj Kumar Jha covered the topic of Using Sources to Form an Argument (3rd March, 2023)</p>

Tarang offered students an unparalleled platform to showcase their talents and compete in a diverse range of disciplines, including Dance, Music, Theatre, Photography, Dramatics, and Debating</p> <p>The annual fest of NCC LSR was finally able to take place for the first time after COVID-19. The event took place on 3rd April 2023 and contingents from several colleges across Delhi participated in the event.</p>

For example-</p> <p>13th October – 19th November, 2022- Short Term Course on Legal Literacy in Collaboration with Delhi State Legal Service Authority was organised by IQAC-LSR</p>

- Faculty members are engaging with the use of audio-visual pedagogical techniques in class along with keeping classes interactive in nature, to maintain student interest. Thus there is emphasis on use of IT tools to make classes interesting and informative.
- In terms of increasing student choices in the courses they get to study, departments took preferences of students for Discipline Specific Electives to keep their interests at the forefront.
- Association activities and society events continued with a high frequency.
- Given that students report mental health issues teachers involved in the RAHAT program and Peer Support Program have increased the reach of these platforms by popularising them in various departments (especially among the first years) and also through student societies.
- New companies were invited for placements to strengthen the placement program of college-The Placement Season 2022–23 of LSR was an extremely eventful year and witnessed the participation of more than 140 companies extending 236 offers to our students. Industry giants like McKinsey & Co., Boston Consulting Group, Kepler Cannon, DE Shaw, Accenture, Dalberg, Trinity, Deloitte, EY and KPMG offered positions in a diverse range of fields such as consulting, finance, marketing and sales, media and research, auditing, and HR. The highest package of INR 44.8 LPA (highest in the University of Delhi), was bagged by Janvi Gupta from Commerce Department. The average package amounted to an aggregate of INR 11.8 LPA while the median package stood at INR 9.5 LPA
