

Re-registration/Improvement in a course/paper:

The grades obtained by the student in a paper is based on the grade obtained in theory (including IA) and the grade obtained in CA(TU/PRAC) in the final marksheet issued by the University of Delhi after the completion of the semester. Each grade can be classified into either of the following two categories:

- **Satisfied** : If the student secures more than 40% marks.
- **Not Satisfied** : If the student secures less than 40% marks.

Based on overall grade obtained in a paper, the student will be awarded either of the following:

- **Grade F**: The student secures less than 40% marks overall.
- **Grade more than F**: The student secures more than 40% marks overall.

Please note that in certain cases, obtaining "more than F grade" in a paper(s) may lead to the improvement or re-registration process for the paper(s). The following is the brief description of various cases leading to mandatory improvement/re-registration cases (refer to Table 2):

Cases I, II and III in Table-2 comprise improvement cases where the student needs to appear in the End Term Theory Examination (**ETTE**) of the concerned course(s)/paper(s) for **improvement/Essential Repeat(ER)**. The cases are as follows:

- **Case-I:** If the student has overall 'F' grade in a paper and "satisfied" grade in CA, then the student has to appear in ETTE of that paper in the next academic year for clearing ER.
- **Case-II:** The student has overall 'more than F' grade in a paper. However, if she has "satisfied" grade in CA and "not satisfied" in IA, but fails to secure at least 40% marks in ETTE and IA taken together, then she has to appear in ETTE of that paper in the next academic year for improvement.
- **Case-III:** The student has overall 'more than F' grade in a paper. However, if the student has "satisfied" grade in CA and "satisfied" in IA, but fails to secure at least 40% marks in ETTE and IA taken together then the student has to appear in ETTE of that paper in the next academic year for improvement.

Cases IV, V, VI and VII in Table-2 comprise re-registration cases as described below:

- **Case-IV:** The student has overall ‘more than F’ grade in a paper. However, if the student has “satisfied” grade in CA and “not satisfied” in IA, and also fails to secure atleast 40% marks in ETTE then the student has to re-register. This implies that she has to attend the course and appear for IA as well as ETTE in the next academic year. However, the CA marks will be carried forward as it is.
- **Case-V:** The student has overall ‘more than F’ grade in a paper. However, if the student has “not satisfied” grade in CA but “satisfied” in IA and ETTE taken together, then the student has to re-register. This implies that she has to attend the course and appear in both theory and practical examinations, along with their CA and IA for improvement in the next academic year.
- **Case-VI:** If the student has overall ‘F’ grade in a paper and “not satisfied” grade in CA but “satisfied” in IA and ETTE taken together, then the student has to re-register. This implies that she has to attend the course and appear in both theory and practical examinations, along with their CA and IA for improvement in the next academic year.
- **Case-VII:** If the student has overall ‘F’ grade in a paper and “not satisfied” grade in CA along with “not satisfied” in IA and ETTE taken together, then the student has to re-register. This implies that she has to attend the course and appear in both theory and practical examinations, along with their CA and IA for improvement in the next academic year.

Hence, it is advised that every student should treat each component IA, CA(TU/PRAC) and ETTE of every paper with seriousness so that they perform satisfactorily in each of the component. Failing in IA/CA(TU/PRAC) in any paper would lead to re-registration, repeating the course and appear in both theory and practical examinations, along with their IA/ CA, as discussed in the above cases.
