LSR at a Glance

Location

A green oasis in the midst of bustling South Delhi, LSR epitomises accessibility in every way. It lies within easy range of the domestic and international airports, rail and bus stations. Medical facilities, shopping centres and cultural activities are also close by.

Enrollment

The college has a strength of nearly 3600 students. Rated amongst the finest colleges in the country, LSR offers an impressive range of academic, cultural and co-curricular activities.



Admission

Admission to LSR is highly competitive. Top-ranking students from across the country apply for admission. Over 2.5 lakh students apply each year, of which around 1100 are selected. Admissions are based on Common University Entrance Test (CUET) with some seats reserved for excellence in sports and extracurricular engagement.

We welcome a diversity of students with disabilities, from Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) and Socially Disadvantaged Groups (SDGs).

Campus Life

LSR offers limited residential accommodation on campus for first-year students. A multi-cuisine café, bookshop, bank, health centre and cyber connectivity are amongst the facilities on campus. 32



Societies and cells cater to the varied interests and passions of students.

Wide-ranging sports facilities include tennis, basketball, volleyball, yoga, badminton, athletics, table tennis, martial arts and chess.

Financial Aid

Student aid in the form of grants, bursaries and scholarships are available.

The REACH Programme reflects the College's commitment to inclusion and social equity by providing students with disabilities with the support, resources, and opportunities that promote holistic development and success.

Academic Life

With a strong foundation of liberal arts education, LSR prepares students for leadership positions in management, government, the academic world and other professional spheres.

LSR offers 11 Degree Programmes in the Social Sciences, Humanities and Commerce while also offering two B.Sc. Programmes in Mathematics and Statistics respectively and, three professional courses in Journalism, Bachelors of Elementary Education and Integrated Teacher Education Programme.

Post-graduate Degree Programmes in various disciplines and a number of short-term Certificate Courses, such as Spanish, Green Teaching for Climate Action, The Science and Practice of Happiness, Design thinking for Innovative Entrepreneurship, Machine learning to Agentic AI, The India Policy Lab, etc. are also offered.

LSR also offers a Diploma Programme in Conflict Transformation and Peacebuilding.

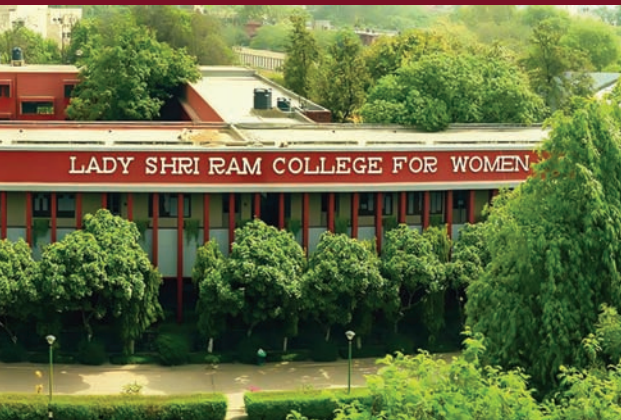

The aim of the institution was to provide access to higher education of quality to women. LSR is a testimony to the far-sighted vision of its founder and his indefatigable enthusiasm to actualize his dream. LSR has always been restless and tireless in fulfilling his vision of 'More education. More education for Women. And more education for more women.'

Consolidating a Legacy

Under the able leadership of the late Dr. Bharat Ram, a philanthropist and visionary par excellence, the College grew from strength to strength. The number of Departments increased, and the College established an enviable reputation – as one of the premier institutes for higher learning in the country. Today, the College is located in a beautiful 15-acre campus in South Delhi, has approximately 3600 students, over 160 faculty, administrative and support staff and 16 courses of study.

Guided by an enlightened and supportive Board of Governors, drawn from the fields of industry, law, journalism, academics and the bureaucracy, under the leadership of its Chairperson Mr. Arun Bharat Ram, the College has become a byword for academic and extracurricular achievement. 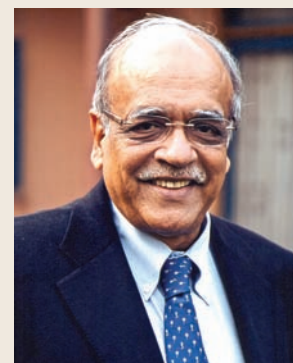

An Enabling Environment

LSR has a unique advantage, being set in the heart of bustling South Delhi while enjoying the calm of extensive grounds and gardens. The College is well connected with domestic and international airports, railways stations, and the Inter-State bus terminus. At a convenient distance are hospitals, shopping centres and recreational facilities. The college has two main buildings—the Old Building and the New Building. The Old Building, with its distinctive Indo-Deco architecture of the 1950s, stands as a testament to the institution's rich heritage, while the New Building, with its contemporary design and modern amenities, reflects its forward-looking vision. In many ways the old building reflects the metaphor of women stepping out of a cloistered world prepared to face the rigours and challenges of a global community. The open courtyards, wide corridors and extensive open brickwork symbolically encourage the winds of change to blow freely, stimulating creativity. The college ground with manicured lawns, trees, flowers, rock garden and bamboo grove celebrate the diversity of nature. The campus has consistently been awarded the Green Cup for 29 consecutive years for the cleanest, greenest and most well-maintained campus in Delhi University.

Lady Shri Ram College offers quality infrastructure to meet the multiple educational needs of its diverse community of students. The college has 105 classrooms nearly all of which are equipped with audio-visual facilities. The College also has two state-of-the-art computer laboratories with full internet connectivity. The entire campus is wi-fi enabled. There are also several spaces within college for fostering the extra-curricular talents of our students. Most cultural programs are organised in the Ramakrishna Dalmia Auditorium which seats about 700 people. There are also four seminar halls in the college, ideal for conducting conferences and workshops -The Upper Seminar Room, Lower Seminar Room, Manju Bharat Ram Hall and New Conference Room. These venues are regularly used for events organised by different departments. The Departments of Psychology and Elementary Education have their own multi-purpose

laboratories for students to conduct practicums. The laboratories are equipped with computers and LCD projectors.

The college considers it vital that all students enjoy equal access to opportunities and spaces. In order to facilitate access for differently-abled students, several ramps have been built and elevators installed in college. A resource centre “Swavalamban” on the college campus provides technological access to visually challenged students. Details of the initiatives that have been taken by the college in this regard are described in the section on ‘Resources.’

Important milestones in terms of infrastructural expansion have been the addition of the Dr. Bharat Ram Academic Complex and the Aung San Suu Kyi Centre for Peace. These beautiful buildings were inaugurated by His Holiness, the Dalai Lama in 2013. The new Academic Complex has modern conference rooms, lectures halls, audio and multi-media labs, an exhibition area, amphitheatre, faculty lounge and students’ common room. The ASSK Centre for Peace, named after one of our best-known and cherished alumnae, began to function formally from its new premises in 2014. Since then, the Centre has been a space for engaging in research and praxis for a Culture of Peace and provides an interactive space for bringing together young people committed to non-violent social change. It is here that classes of the Conflict Transformation and Peace building Diploma course are held. The building has well equipped classrooms, discussion rooms and seminar rooms for deliberation and intensive discussions on issues related to peace building. It also has a well-stocked library with books, journals, newspapers and films and posters on a wide range of topics related to conflict transformation, peace studies, religion and gender. The Centre is wi-fi enabled.



College Policy on Ragging

Lady Shri Ram College for Women is a zero-tolerance zone for ragging. All complaints related to any kind of physical, mental, emotional, digital and financial bullying/ragging are addressed immediately by the College constituted anti-ragging committee.

Resources

Library

LSR's superbly equipped, expertly maintained Library with a computerised, user-friendly data filing system functions as an invaluable aid to every aspiring scholar. The library is e-linked to the Delhi University network, facilitating access to texts and resources from all over the world. It boasts of an impressive stock of books numbering over a lakh.

It also subscribes to a range of national and international journals, making it one of the largest selections in the University of Delhi. The general library with its open-stack system, spacious reading room, easy accessibility to e-resources and reference section provides an atmosphere conducive to the exercise of mental discovery. Students are encouraged to become sagacious users of the library.



The REACH Programme- Equal Opportunity Cell

REACH, an acronym for Reaffirming Equity, Access, Capacity and Humanism, is an initiative that was created at LSR with support from the Foundation for Academic Excellence and Access (FAEA) in 2002. REACH seeks to address the challenge of building an informed and engaged community by preserving the multihued canvas of coexistence in society. REACH is a change agent that empowers students from disadvantaged backgrounds by creating access and opportunities for them. By giving scholarships to students with potential and engaging in activities that are experiential and trans-disciplinary in nature, REACH offers a dialogue-oriented, liberating and heterogeneously sourced palette of activities to spur young minds on in their quest to excel. It also imparts entrepreneurial skills to students through a range of workshops, training programmes and field trips. As part of our diversity, equality and inclusion initiatives, the *Students' Handbook* is published in an accessible format, while REACH-Equal Opportunity Cell, brings out its magazine *Aarohan* in Braille.



Swavalamban Resource Centre

A state-of-the-art Resource Centre for students with disabilities, formally set up in 2013, ensures accessible study material and provides an enabling research environment to cater to students with special needs. Equipped with latest assistive technology including a Braille Embosser, Screen Reading Software, Lex-Cam Scanner, Book Scanner, DAISY Recorders and Players and ten computer systems with OCR Software both in English and Hindi, the Resource Centre facilitates the academic development of students with disability and those belonging to disadvantaged sections of society.



The Centre has been upgraded in 2025 with a range of new advanced AI-enabled and assistive technologies, including Hark AI and other accessibility tools, a refreshable Braille display, digital magnifiers, audiobooks, AI-powered voice recorders, upgraded computer systems, ergonomic accessories, large-print keyboards, and specialised educational software. The Resource Centre ensures that students with disadvantages achieve their full potential and become self-reliant, independent and productive members of society. To support this vision, the College has appointed a dedicated Resource Centre Coordinator and Accessibility Trainer.

Residence Hall

The LSR Residence Hall is the nucleus of a harmonious community environment and has a longstanding tradition of celebrating multicultural and ethno-religious diversity. Following extensive renovation and repair work, it will reopen this year to welcome first-year students of 2026. More than 100 refurbished rooms will accommodate around 150 students.

The Residence Hall is specially designed to support students who are new to Delhi, offering a secure and comfortable environment that fosters a sense of belonging and helps smooth their transition into college life. In line with this aim, the hostel will be available for a duration of one year to first-year students only. However, students with disabilities (PWBD) may be considered for a longer stay.



The hostel features a range of simply furnished single, double, and triple rooms to suit various preferences. Residents will enjoy the convenience of an in-house kitchen serving four nutritious, wholesome meals each day. Situated in an excellent location, the Residence Hall offers easy access to Delhi's public transport system, making it even more connected. With its bright common room, beautiful lawn, visitor's lounge and facilities for recreation, its welcoming living quarters and fine cuisine, the Residence is a home away from home.

Wellness Centre

Committed to the holistic well-being of our community, the College provides comprehensive physical and mental health support through a dedicated Medial Room and Counselling Services.

Medical Room

Our well-equipped medical room features two beds, six wheelchairs, oxygen cylinders, a blood pressure monitor, a sanitary pad dispenser, and essential first-aid supplies, managed daily by an on-campus nurse and supported by a doctor who visits twice weekly. Students with chronic conditions are encouraged to lodge their medical records with the clinic for personalized care, while established emergency protocols ensure immediate medical intervention or rapid transfer to nearby premium facilities like Moolchand Healthcare and Nova Kailash Medical Center. Hostellers additionally benefit from an in-house infirmary stocked with Over the Counter (OTC) medicines.

Counselling Services

The College Counselling Cell is committed to promote emotional well-being and mental health of students and staff. It provides a safe, confidential, and supportive space where individuals can seek professional guidance and assistance. The transition to college life often brings academic



pressures, career-related concerns, interpersonal challenges, and also personal adjustments. Therefore, the Counselling Cell supports students in navigating these experiences through a range of services, including supportive counselling for stress, anxiety and emotional difficulties, grief counselling, assistance with adjustment and adaptation to college life, guidance in managing social and interpersonal relationships, time-management and study related concerns, career guidance and also crisis intervention when required. Special attention is also given to students from diverse regions of India as they adapt to a new academic and social environment. The Counsellor offers full-time offline services from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm, Monday to Friday. To ensure continued access to mental health support, online counselling sessions are also provided during examination periods and vacations. In addition to individual counselling services, the Cell also proactively organises workshops, awareness programmes and interactive sessions on diverse mental health topics to foster a culture of self-awareness and psychological well-being across the campus.

The Peer Support Program is a mental health initiative led by trained student volunteers under the supervision of faculty members from the Department of Psychology. It is a platform for peer-to-peer communication which enables social connectedness within the college community of the same fraternity that have certain similar experiences. The motto of Peer Support Program is 'Extend, Express, Empower'. Throughout the academic year, trained peer supporters provide a safe and non-judgmental space to peers to share their concerns, seek guidance, and access appropriate support services when needed. Activities are organised, including orientation sessions for new students, awareness campaigns on mental health, stress management workshops, group discussions, and interactive sessions on topics such as coping with academic pressure, building self-esteem, body image, effective communication, and maintaining healthy relationships.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

There is a duly constituted Statutory Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) at Lady Shri Ram College for Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment against women on campus. The Committee comprises faculty members, representatives of non-teaching staff and student representatives elected from among the student body every two years.

Cafés and Eateries

The bright and colourful café in college is a scene of conviviality and exuberant energy. Conveniently located between the

Residence Hall and the main college building, it is always abuzz with activity and serves as a popular meeting place for students. Arguably the best students' cafeteria in the University, the café serves food ranging from light refreshments to substantial meals at reasonable rates. A variety of affordable food options are also provided by the Nescafé kiosk, Veni's South Indian kiosk, and the Mother Dairy outlet.

The Placement Cell

The Placement Cell at LSR connects students with top companies, NGOs and start-ups for internships and full-time roles. It equips students with career guidance, skill-building workshops and recruitment drives to turn potential into purpose. This year too it continued its strong placement record, securing placements and internships for students with leading organisations such as McKinsey & Company, Amazon, Meesho, KPMG, EY Parthenon, Barclays, NTT Data, Korn Ferry, Macquarie, Barclays, L.E.K. Consulting, World Wide Technology, Boston Consulting Group, Accenture Strategy, House of EdTech among others, thereby offering a diverse range of career pathways across sectors.

The Alumna Cell

Since its inception in 1956, Lady Shri Ram College for Women has cultivated a formidable legacy of distinguished alumnae. They consistently achieve prominence worldwide, spanning sectors such as politics, literature, corporate industry, entertainment, and sports. Trailblazing leaders such as Gita Gopinath (First Deputy Managing Director, IMF), Naina Lal Kidwai (Former Country Head, HSBC India), and Vinita Bali (Former MD, Britannia Industries) represent just a fraction of this remarkable heritage. To bridge the past and the present, the Alumna Cell, a proactive, student-led body, works to foster vibrant, lifelong connections between the institution and its graduates. Through a dynamic range of networking events, interactive sessions, and mentorship initiatives organised throughout the academic year, the Cell actively maintains and strengthens these invaluable ties.

Office of International Programmes

The Office of International Programmes keeps students abreast regarding institutions for post-graduate studies, other avenues of higher education and organises counselling sessions for admissions to universities across the world. It provides information about summer schools and online international courses. It continues to expand the global engagements of LSR through academic interactions, collaborations, and student exchange opportunities. The Office hosts international delegations and engages with representatives from leading universities from across the globe to foster dialogue on expanding our international partnerships and explore academic exchange possibilities. Its mandate includes expanding student and faculty international mobility, nurturing collaborative international research by often hosting reputed faculty and scholars from international universities, and fostering interdisciplinary learning, reinforcing the College's commitment to global academic integration.



Teaching Learning at LSR

Teaching-learning is understood to be a dialogic process that encourages students to question, to think, to reflect, and to analyse. The entire approach is student centric, keeping in mind the diverse nature of the student body. An annual calendar is set, time-tables are organised before the commencement of the new semester, work plans are readied in advance and students' activities are planned in consultation with student societies and associations.

The college follows the university's prescribed curriculum and assessment policy. While transacting the curriculum and implementing the assessment directives, the college adopts a blend of conventional and innovative pedagogy to meet the requirements of the students. Regular classes are taken by all teachers to ensure high academic quality and rigour. Attendance rules are strictly adhered to inculcate discipline and regularity amongst students. Delhi University's guidelines for students' internal assessment are followed. Feedback is provided during the tutorials. It is not surprising therefore that the college has outstanding results in the examinations conducted by the University of Delhi.



LSR believes that the purpose of higher education is to research, reflect on, and critically interpret the world we live in. Teachers and students engage in this ruminative activity consistently and diligently. New ideas and new ways of understanding are constantly being created in the classrooms and seminar halls of LSR. Students are encouraged to make seminar presentations, write reports and undertake projects and surveys as well. Internships and field visits are encouraged, and a well organised student mentoring programme is in place. While the lecture format is followed as prescribed by the University, the college encourages innovative pedagogy through group activities, group research, extensive use of documentary films, the internet, field visits, interaction with scholars, practitioners, and peers. The college has a learning, resource and research centre that was set up with funding by the UGC to encourage interdisciplinary academic activities.



LSR is committed to a meaningful partnership between students and teachers. A variety of audio-visual aids are used in the classroom including documentaries, films, media, photographs, artefacts, and people (as guest speakers or discussants), as well as field visits to the Parliament, museums, hospitals, schools, factories, monuments, and heritage sites, particularly in the local area. Such initiatives make the classroom a 'shared' space by weaving in participatory strategies, encouraging individuals or groups of students to take up topics from within and around the syllabus. The teacher acts as facilitator who suggests, steers and guides.



LSR has kept pace with the rapid changes in the world of communication and incorporated these to enhance the teaching-learning and administrative aspects of the college very successfully. The college has over two hundred computer terminals, and ICT is used for administrative, accounting and record-keeping purposes. Faculty and students make extensive use of the Wi-Fi facility for

reading and research. Most classrooms are equipped with ICT facilities. The college conducts workshops to explain the use of this technology, especially AI, with caution, prudence and responsibility.

Our Faculty

At LSR, our exceptional faculty work tirelessly to create what we fondly call the 'magic of LSR'. Teaching is far from a lost art here. Our faculty lead with passion, purpose, and the quiet superpower of making students actually care about learning. The excellence of LSR's faculty extends beyond the classroom. They seek to maximise the opportunities for genuine reflection that college life provides, resisting oversimplification and nurturing critical thinking skills essential to a liberal education. At the same time, they actively contribute to the advancement of knowledge through publications in leading Scopus-indexed national and international journals. LSR faculty members have published books, monographs, articles and other academic materials with reputed publishing houses around the world. The faculty are frequently invited to deliver keynote addresses, chair international conferences and panel discussions of repute and present their research work at conferences in and outside the country.

Rankings and Accolades

The mission at LSR is to provide higher education of unimpeachable quality, to nurture academic excellence and critical enquiry and to encourage an engaged sense of responsibility to the larger community.

LSR is consistently ranked among the top colleges in the country in nationwide polls. LSR has also been awarded an impressive CGPA of 3.53 on four-point scale at A++ Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The college has been placed among the top institutes in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), a ranking methodology adopted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India, to rank institutions of higher education in India. Our exceptional 'Graduation Outcomes' are a testimony to our commitment to academic excellence. LSR students win several gold medals as toppers and position holders in various subjects at the university examinations. Over the years, the College has maintained the highest percentage of first divisions in the University of Delhi and a near-nil dropout rate amongst students.



Lady Shri Ram College for women promotes the pursuit of excellence and the development of global competencies in its students. The College provides its students with exposure to several reputed institutions of higher learning within and outside India. The College regularly hosts faculty members from various national and international educational institutions. The College also encourages students to participate in research projects. These projects have a distinct interdisciplinary approach and have contributed much to

students' learning in research design and methodology.



LSR periodically offers short term certificate courses such as:

Mathematics

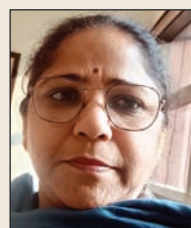

Philosophy

Our knowledge of the world rests on certain presuppositions that define the parameters of truth but are seldom put to test. Philosophy examines such complacent applications of formulaic thought patterns with a view to forge critical understandings of 'being'-in-the-world.' The discipline thereby encompasses the evolution of argumentative form and content over the last two millennia in India and Europe. It involves an interface with ideas that have transformed intellectual landscapes across human civilizations.

Students are encouraged to hone their aptitude for original analysis through interactive lectures and tutorials. There is an effort to incorporate expertise beyond the classroom as part of the Association endeavours. 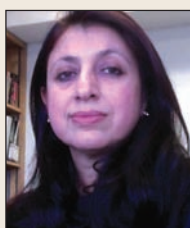

Psychology

Sanskrit

The Department of Sanskrit at Lady Shri Ram College was established in 1956. In the six decades of its existence, the Department has earnestly promoted the appreciation of one of the richest and most scientific languages in the world. Students are encouraged to see Sanskrit not merely as a language, but as one of the most important repositories of Indian culture and recognise its significance for comprehending the philosophical and religious traditions of our country. The course introduces students to Vedic and Upanishadic lore, the history of ancient Indian culture, philosophy-self management through Gita, Arthashastra and other areas of Indology. Short modules on linguistics and philosophy of language, reasoning and ontology, aesthetics and Indian theatre, mathematics and astronomy and Indian science have also been introduced. In the classroom, texts are taught through different interpretations. Students are encouraged to read selective readings, Sanskrit magazines and journals to strengthen their grasp of the language. Seminars such as on Vedic Mathematics, Kinship & Social Justice in Ancient Hindu Legal System, Archaeology and Sanskrit are regularly conducted to further students' learning. Students of the Sanskrit Department study epigraphy and archaeology and hence are eligible to pursue a Masters degree in this field. Students who graduate from the Department have established successful careers at museums and in fields such as manuscript studies, archaeology, teaching and translation. Under the NEP, various subjects from the Indian knowledge tradition such as Ayurveda & Nutrition, Yoga in Practice, Vedic Mathematics, Script Writing etc. are being taught to non-Sanskrit students as well. The Sanskrit Department regularly organises workshops and lectures by scholars on various topics related to the Indian knowledge tradition, thereby enhancing the student's knowledge of the subject.

Students of the Department are constantly encouraged to enhance their research abilities, attend seminars and remain up-to-date on the developments in the discipline. Several career options are available to students after graduation. These include quality control for industries, biotechnology, market research, corporate planning, banking, trade, medicine and defence.

Conflict Transformation and Peacebuilding

(Diploma Programme)

Conflict Transformation is a newly emerging, expanding and innovative discipline that is opening new frontiers of knowledge. The growing realization that the world has not yet effectively devised systems to cope with intra and inter-national conflicts has led civil society to search for creative options that place 'people' at the centre of peace processes. It is in this context that the field of Conflict Transformation has been conceptualized.



The diploma programme in Conflict Transformation and Peace Building seeks to address a growing need for education on the paradigms, models and skills that can assist societies to transform conflicts non-violently. The Diploma course is a one-year integrated programme spread over two semesters. It is offered to undergraduate and graduate students, NGO workers, diplomats, lawyers, media persons and grassroots workers across the country. The course is interactive, combining lectures, case studies, panel and group discussions, seminars, role-playing, field trips, film screenings and interactions with senior practitioners and scholars. It has an important research methodology component followed by the writing of a dissertation and the conduction of a viva voce. The faculty is drawn from within the college as well as from the wide network of experts in the field. The examinations are conducted by the University of Delhi, co-terminus with the conduction of the other examinations of the University. The application process starts in the month of June. Admissions are conducted on the basis of a written Statement of Purpose followed by an interview. This diploma is offered under the aegis of the Aung San Suu Kyi (ASSK) Centre for Peace at Lady Shri Ram College.

Placements at LSR

The Placement Cell of Lady Shri Ram College for Women upholds the institution's long-standing tradition of excellence, connecting students with some of the world's most prestigious organisations and preparing them for leadership across diverse professional domains.

During the 2025–26 placement season, more than 50 leading organisations participated in the recruitment process, offering more than 170 opportunities across consulting, finance, marketing, analytics, product management, and allied sectors. The highest package offered stood at Rs. 36.25 LPA, while the average and median packages were Rs. 13.54 LPA and Rs. 13.1 LPA, respectively. The internship programme also witnessed exceptional success, with 135 internships offered by over 40 organisations, including both full-time and part-time opportunities. The highest internship stipend reached Rs. 3,60,000 for an eight-week engagement, while the average stipend stood at Rs. 67,745, underscoring the quality and competitiveness of opportunities available to LSR students.

Beyond recruitment, the Placement Cell is committed to ensuring that every student is equipped to navigate an evolving professional landscape. The Cell organises several skill-building and career

development sessions featuring accomplished professionals from leading organisations, covering areas such as consulting, finance, public policy, marketing, and strategic problem-solving.

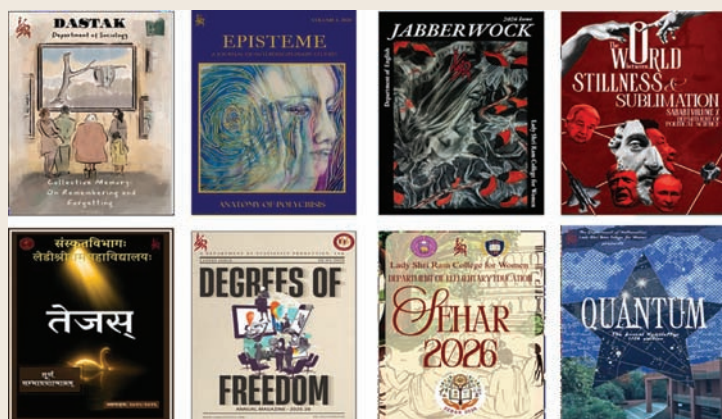

Academic Activities

LSR offers a rich array of activities designed to respond to the highest intellectual and societal aspirations of our students. In addition to classroom teaching, seminars, workshops, lectures and presentations by distinguished visitors to the college are regular features. The college hosts several national and international conferences and over 500 distinguished visitors are invited to interact with the student body every year.



The departments of the college publish several academic journals and magazines which encourage students to showcase their intellectual as well as creative abilities. The college magazine is also published every year which features articles, essays, and other features by students in several languages such as Bengali, Bhoti, French, Hindi, Japanese, Khasi, Korean, Maithili, Malayalam, Marathi, Odia, Sanskrit, Spanish, Telugu,

and Urdu. Besides, LSR regularly conducts a number of Skill Development Workshops such as the 'Digital India Awareness' (in collaboration with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology) and 'Trauma informed skills series for peer support' (in alliance with Humraahi Psychotherapy), among others were organised last year.



The college fosters a rigorous, highly vibrant research ecosystem that transitions students from consumers of knowledge into active producers of scholarship. The college treats research as a critical tool for civic engagement and academic leadership. Faculty members at LSR are prominent contributors to contemporary academic discourse in their respective fields, actively publishing in top-tier national and international journals.

In alignment with the goals of the National Education Policy (2020), to encourage interdisciplinary and collaborative research between faculty and students, **Dr. Bharat Ram Research Grant** is awarded every year to faculty led research projects after a rigorous selection process. Students engage as active research partners in these projects, giving them a unique opportunity to master advanced methodologies, translate classroom discourse into impactful social advocacy, and build for themselves a seasoned academic profile prior to graduation.



Further, as part of Delhi University's undergraduate program, students who go on to the fourth year must write an academic dissertation or undertake a research project. Under the guidance of a faculty supervisor, students identify research gaps, formulate hypotheses, construct theoretical frameworks, and master data collection, whether through archival research, field surveys, or computational modeling. This experience creates a seamless bridge to master's and doctoral programmes globally, training students to publish in peer-reviewed journals and contribute directly to their respective disciplines. The college has established a dedicated **Research and Publication Forum** which conducts weekly colloquiums in addition to several workshops, talks, and lectures to help students in their research endeavours. Students are trained in formal methodologies, quantitative/qualitative analysis, citation mechanics, and research ethics.



Annual Departmental Academic Conferences

An important part of the college calendar are the annual academic conferences organised by each department. Departments organise several national and international conferences that keep the intellectual environment of the college vibrant throughout the year.

SAMAGAM: The annual academic conference of the Department of B. A. Programme is Samagam. It addresses a variety of interdisciplinary issues including women in STEM, Cultural changes and their impact, Entrepreneurship and Innovation among Women and many others. The event sees various speaker sessions, panel discussions, and competitions that attract students from LSR and other colleges.



COMQUEST: This is the annual academic conference of the Department of Commerce. It provides a forum for exchange of ideas amongst the brightest students in the country and tries to foster innovation, encourage change, and discuss the latest developments in the ever-buzzing corporate world.

ECONVISTA: This is the annual academic conference of the Economics Department. It has an array of non-competitive, competitive, online and interactive events. Econvista sees participation in huge numbers from various local, national as well as international colleges and proves to be intellectually stimulating. The keynote address of last year's event was given by Ms. Mandakini Kaul, Regional Coordinator (South Asia), World Bank.

SEHAR: The annual academic conference of the Department of Elementary Education revolves around issues pertinent to school education. A keynote address is usually followed by panel discussions and by workshops conducted by eminent persons on themes like story writing, maths made easy etc.



LITMUS: Litmus, the annual academic conference of the English department has a number of events including thought-provoking panel discussions, paper presentations, art and photograph exhibitions on a variety of topics and their manifestations to story-telling and narrativization. Last year's event was held as an international conference which provided a robust platform for examining the intersections of language, survival and academic futurity.

VAGARTH: The annual academic conference of the Department of Hindi is Vagarth. It includes events like students presenting group songs and even recitation of poetry and readings from the works of famous authors along with paper presentations and panel discussions.

MAAZI-O-MUSTAQBIL: The Department of History's annual academic conference addresses a variety of interesting and contemporary topics. It usually includes carefully curated talks, panel discussions, screenings and presentations.



JUXTAPOSE: The annual academic conference of the Department of Journalism aims at deliberating and bringing on stage all issues concerning society and the media and address areas of censorship, film journalism, fake news, changing patterns of films, ownership and media trial.



ENIGMA: The Department of Mathematics' annual academic conference includes panel discussions, paper presentations by students, quiz and fun events like treasure hunt, and other competitive events. Students from several colleges and various schools also attend these events.

ALETHEIA: The Department of Philosophy's academic conference is Aletheia. It includes a range of talks, group discussions, competitions and other activities. Each activity sees enthusiastic participation of a large number of students and teachers from within and outside the Department.

POLPOURRI: The Political Science Department organises its annual academic conference, Polpourri usually as a one-day academic event preceded by several pre-conference talks and events or as a two-day event on a variety of interesting topics with paper presentations, discussions and other non-competitive events. Last year's event was held as an international conference which saw eminent speakers from around the world interacting with students.

ZEITGEIST: The annual academic conference of the Department of Psychology focuses on interesting topics related to the discipline. Events organised include keynote addresses by eminent psychologists and national paper presentation competitions that have a number of entries from various colleges from across the country.

SAMSKRITI: The annual academic conference of the Department of Sanskrit is Samskriti. Students from various colleges participate in this event and it hosts a variety of events, including paper presentations and panel discussions.

KULA: The Sociology Department holds its academic conference, Kula, every year which sees active participation from students from various colleges and universities. It usually includes invited lectures, talks, panel discussions, screenings, and paper presentations. Last year, Kula was organised as a two-day international conference.



MOMENTS: The Department of Statistics' annual academic conference sees participation of students from all across Delhi NCR and nearby regions. The conference focuses on different areas every year like finance, business, programming, statistics and several others.

We secured the Runner-Up position in the Best Company Competition in 2024–25 and the Second Runner-Up position in the following year. Many of our driven and committed students have excelled in prestigious NCC competitions and camps, bringing laurels to the college. Some of our cadets have represented the country through the Youth Exchange Programme abroad, while several others have represented the Directorate at national-level camps, including the Republic Day Camp, All India Thal Sainik Camp and the Indo-Bhutan Youth Friendship Camp. Our cadets have also earned distinguished recognitions such as the DG Recommendation, Young Achiever Award and the opportunity to represent the Directorate during the Hall of Fame Briefing at the Republic Day Camp. Through activities such as horse riding, rock climbing, scuba diving, marathons, and cyclothons, the NCC at LSR continues to foster confidence, resilience, teamwork, and a spirit of service among its cadets.



The National Service Scheme (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a community service programme to build social consciousness in students. NSS provides an opportunity for students in the capacity of volunteers to venture out of their comfort zones and make a difference to society. Apart from being a part of activities launched by Delhi University NSS, we, at LSR, have undertaken 27 projects in which more than 700 volunteers work ceaselessly and engage in various issues of social concerns and upliftment of marginalized sections of society. NSS Volunteers actively dedicate their efforts to caring for the elderly, intervention techniques for the differently-abled, working with animal shelters and health centers associated



with patients suffering from cancer, organizing NSS Varshik Samaroh every year to promote women's social entrepreneurs and NGOs, organizing blood donation campaigns, educating the underprivileged children, creating awareness and participating in cleanliness drives in the nearest adopted village at zamrudpur and college vicinity are some of the significant voluntary engagements of NSS LSR volunteers.

World University Service (WUS)

World University Service (WUS) is an international Non-Governmental Organization with a network of national committees in more than 60 countries. It was instituted as a non-performing arts society in the Academic Year 2004-2005. Since then, it has aimed to raise awareness and dispel myths about a variety of issues, focusing largely on the physical and psychological health concerns of individuals. WUS also enjoys a consultative status with several United National Agencies. In keeping with this broader aim, the WUS programme at LSR promotes a sense of physical and psychological well-being among the student community and addresses issues of health and hygiene. WUS creates awareness on issues that are of concern to students through seminars, workshops, health camps, and talks.

Institutions' Innovation Council (IIC)

Innovation in educational institutions encourages teachers and students to explore, research, and use all the tools to uncover something new. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India has established MHRD's Innovation Cell (MIC) at AICTE with a purpose to systematically foster the culture of innovation in all Higher Education Institutions (HEIs). Lady Shri Ram College for Women was selected by MHRD's Innovation Cell (MIC) for the constitution of Innovation Council in the college to promote innovation among its students by encouraging, inspiring, and nurturing them through periodic activities. The Council has been actively taking various steps to promote innovation and entrepreneurship endeavours among students by hosting a multitude of talks, competitions, workshops and extending support to students.

Extension and Outreach Programmes

We seek to inculcate a deep sense of social responsibility through Reflection – Engagement – Empowerment– Outreach and attempt to break barriers both within and without, in the individual mind and in society. These four pillars of our conscientization programme attempt to break barriers both within and without, in the individual mind and in society. Through workshops, discussions, teaching modules and field trips the extension and outreach programmes in LSR reinforce the link between learning and community and sensitize students to wider social issues of gender equity, sustainable development and environmental concerns.



Women's Development Cell

LSR is an institution for women where the nature and dimensions of the multitudinous challenges faced by women in society, as well as the role of women in redressing these, are held to be of paramount importance. We believe in providing our young women with a new conceptual vocabulary that interrogates the limits placed by structures of patriarchy. Community development projects

are carried out with a focus on issues that are relevant to women. LSR provides a space for discussion through workshops and study camps on gender related topics. It sensitizes students to problems faced by women whose voices need to be heard more in the meta-narratives of social enquiry.

Dhyana

Dhyana, the Society for Consciousness and Awareness, provides students with a space for turning the introspective gaze within and, at the same time, expand their horizons and connect with the world. Through this classroom of the future, students are encouraged to explore the various dimensions of their inner landscapes through workshops on themes like Indian Heritage, Contemporary Art, Concepts of Space and Time, Human Rights and Holistic Health and Ecologies, Economics, Politics and Culture in a Globalizing World.



VAPP – The Voluntary Agency Placement Programme

VAPP is a programme that provides opportunities for students to make a positive contribution to community development and social welfare and to explore alternative career possibilities in the voluntary sector. It is designed to create awareness among students about the privileges and attendant responsibility of their education and sensitize them to the impact that their initiative can achieve. This programme aims to place volunteers with selected NGOs working at the grass roots level with marginalized sections of society.

Freeships & Scholarships

A large number of freeships as well as scholarships are awarded to students at Lady Shri Ram College every year. Our students are encouraged to apply for scholarships offered by various government bodies, including PMSS, Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan Scholarship, Inspire Scholarship, the National Scholarship Portal, and the Directorate of Higher Education Scholarship. A concerted effort is made to ensure that each student who requires financial assistance is provided with the same. Freeships are available to all students disbursed solely based on their financial needs. Most scholarships are merit cum need based, and the criterion of parental income is kept in mind while deciding eligibility. Some of the scholarships given in college are listed as follows:

1. G.L. Bansal Scholarship: This scholarship is awarded to one or two students in the second year who have obtained good scores in the University examinations and have also been active participants in college activities.
2. The Morada and Yashoda Chetna Scholarships: These scholarships are meant for visually challenged students of any year. Two or three such scholarships are awarded each year.
3. The ELSA Scholarships: These are three to four scholarships given to meritorious students who have done well in their first or second year University examinations and come from very disadvantaged backgrounds.
4. Sh. Onkar Nath Pandit Scholarships: It is mainly given to final-year students who have been among the top-ranking students in their course.
5. Shri Hari Dayal Walia Scholarship: It is mainly given to final-year students who have been among the top-ranking students in their course.

6. Tejaswi Rao Scholarship: It is a scholarship instituted in memory of Ms Rao and is meant for a student from the Journalism department. The scholarship pays the entire fees for the course.
7. Neha Puri Scholarships: These scholarships were established in memory of Ms Puri and are intended for students from the Political Science department. Two scholarships are awarded, covering the entire course fees.
8. Shri Manohar Shyam Joshi Scholarships: These are available to students of the Hindi and Journalism Departments. Usually, two scholarships are given.
9. Shikha Chhabra Scholarship: This scholarship is instituted in memory of a former student of the Economics department and is usually awarded to a student from that department.
10. Dr Sheila Grover Memorial Scholarship: This is a scholarship given to a deserving student, preferably from the Hindi department.
11. Chhotu Ram Rathee Memorial Scholarship: This scholarship is given to a deserving student, preferably of the Economics department.
12. Hallac Blackrock Scholarship: This is a merit cum needs scholarship for students of the Statistics/ Mathematics Department.
13. Tazim Imam Scholarship: This is a scholarship for a truly deserving and meritorious student of the final year.
14. Vimla Sain Bhagat Scholarship: This scholarship is instituted by an ex-faculty member of the Philosophy department. This merit cum need scholarship is for a student of Philosophy & Psychology.
15. Zubek Currimbhoy Scholarship: This merit cum needs scholarship is for an English Student.
16. Diljeet Kaur Sikka Scholarship: This scholarship is given to a needy first-year student.
17. Kunj Gupta Scholarship: This scholarship is awarded to first-year students from the Department of History.
18. Saroj Devi Scholarship: This scholarship is given to a meritorious final-year student from the Sanskrit Department.

In addition to the above, the following merit-based scholarships are provided to students for academic excellence by the respective departments:

Students' Union

The Students' Union, an elected body of student representatives comprises four members of the student body elected by the students of the entire college and reflects the needs and aspirations of the student community. As a representative body, the Students' Union strives to address all the concerns of its constituency, ensuring that every student gets to experience and thrive in the magic of LSR. Besides acting as an interface between students, the College administration, and outside agencies, the Students' Union is also responsible for coordinating with different departments and societies to ensure every event at LSR is a grand success and enriches the everyday experience in college.

Student Societies

Student societies provide the student community with the widest possible choice of co-curricular and extra-curricular endeavour. Students take the initiative in organizing meets, competitive events, workshops, lecture demonstrations and cultural festivals.

Projekt, the film and photography society encourages its members to engage with meaningful cinema and initiates students into viewing film texts critically. Apart from holding film appreciation courses, it invites eminent photographers and filmmakers to conduct photography and film making workshops.

Hive, the Fine Arts Society, is the place for budding artists, painters, sculptors and all those who experiment and innovate with the many styles and forms of art. This art club offers students an opportunity to develop their creative sensibilities through activities like folk art, poster making, rangoli, etc. The society organises workshops on stained glass, Madhubani, origami, Worli, candle making, pottery and terracotta.



The Performing Arts



The music societies of the college, comprising of **Indian Music Society, Saaz (Instrumental Music)** and **Western Music Society** encourage young talent. Along with singing, composing and organizing intra-college cultural events, students of these societies bag prizes at virtually every inter-college event- group, duet, solo or instrumental. They have been invited to perform at the South Asia Human rights Conference, Youth Festival, the British Council, the Canadian High Commission and the World Heritage Society for Performing Arts and have also

collaborated with the band EUPHORIA for a promotional video on the girl child.

LSR has a **SPICMACY Chapter** which provides a space for promoting awareness about Indian culture amongst youth. This chapter has organised several concerts by renowned dancers, vocalist, puppeteers and instrumentalists. The **Dance Society** provides an active platform for a variety of talents, ranging from Indian classical dance to Western forms and choreography. Enthusiastic members of this society can be seen practicing at all hours of the day in the Common Room and the Foyer. The results are evident as winning laurels has become a habit for them. The society also organises workshops on creative dance forms. The **Dramatics Society** taps a range of theatrical talent throughout the year, which culminates in annual productions in Street Theatre, Stage Play and Mime. Members of this society win laurels at numerous inter-college theatre festivals. Students receive training from some of the best professional directors in the country and learn to experiment with light, sound, motion, props and body movement.

The **Public Speaking Society** includes the **English Debating Society**, the **Hindi Debating Society**, the **Quiz Society** and the **Elocution Society**. The **Model United Nations (MUN) Society** provides a dynamic platform for students to compete in national and international conferences. It serves as an intellectual forum where students can critically analyze global issues, formulate perspectives, and confidently articulate their opinions. With its emphasis on articulate expression and logically nuanced argument, debating adds another dimension to LSR's tradition of producing capable leaders. LSR debaters have done extremely well at traditional and parliamentary debates at the inter college and inter university levels. The **Quiz Society** believes that life is all about questions and an unending search for answers. It organises quizzes on a plethora of subjects and caters to a variety of interests. The **Magazine & Creative Writing Society** offers a forum for all those geniuses who are driven by the urge to express themselves creatively in a variety of ways.



Interface

A student initiative unique to LSR, Interface provides a space for the college community to interact with distinguished leaders from the social, political and economic fields. Through talks, workshops and films on issues ranging from India's security, democratic practices to the role of media, women and the law, education and globalization, Interface creates and enhances awareness.

Prakriti

Prakriti, the Environment Society of LSR, serves as a vibrant forum for promoting environmental consciousness and sustainable development. Through discussions, workshops, campaigns, and interactive sessions, the society seeks to promote awareness and inspire meaningful action towards ecological sustainability. Activities undertaken in recent years have included plantation drives, expert talks, workshops on sustainable practices, reading sessions, E-waste disposal awareness and nature walks that foster appreciation for local biodiversity. 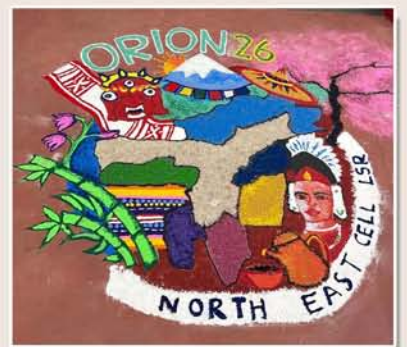

Admission Process

Lady Shri Ram College for Women is a constituent College of the University of Delhi and admissions would be in accord with the guidelines formulated by the University of Delhi for 2026-2027.

Every year, a large number of students apply to the College, and we aim to make the admission process smooth and hassle-free. Please read this section carefully to get acquainted with the admission requirements and procedures. Students who wish to study at Lady Shri Ram College can opt for any of the following Honours courses – Commerce, Economics, English, Hindi, History, Journalism, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sanskrit, Sociology and Statistics. In addition, LSR offers a B.A. Programme course (with a variety of subject combinations), a Bachelors in Elementary Education and Integrated Teachers Education Program (ITEP).

For admission to Undergraduate Programmes at University of Delhi, all candidates (including those applying under supernumerary quota) must register for CUET (UG)-2026 at cuet.nta.nic.in

For seat allocations and admissions, candidates must apply to the Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS(UG)-2026) of University of Delhi. Details related to allocations and admissions through CSAS(UG)-2026 etc. will be notified separately. Candidate must visit www.admission.uod.ac.in on a regular basis.

Gap year will not be a bar for purpose of admission to undergraduate programmes. However, such candidates must also appear in CUET (UG) - 2026 for admissions in the academic year 2026-27.

The College reserves the right to allocate disciplinary courses/major/optional to the students depending on availability of seats, faculty, and infrastructure.

Admission to M. A./ M. Sc.

Admission to the M.A. Course is done through the University of Delhi. Special Categories

LSR strives to provide a seamless and successful academic experience for all students. 22.5% of the total seats are reserved for candidates belonging to the SC/ST category, 27% are reserved for candidates belonging to the OBC category (Non-Creamy Layer from Central Government List), 5% seats are reserved for Persons with Disabilities (PwD) and 10% seats are reserved for the EWS category. In addition to admissions under the regular categories, the College also admits students under various supernumerary and special quotas, including the Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW), Kashmiri Migrants (KM), Orphans Quota (OQ), Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for Jammu and Kashmir (PMSSS), Single Girl Child (SGC) Quota, and the Ward Quota for Employees of the University of Delhi (WQ), in accordance with the policies and guidelines of the University of Delhi.

SC/ST/OBC/PwBD/EWS Category Students

Sports and Extra-curricular Activities (ECA) Categories

Candidates desirous of admission to Undergraduate Programme under the sports quota must appear in CUET (UG) - 2026. For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats, a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET(UG)-2026 score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances. The candidate seeking benefit of any participation/winning certificate must submit evidence of having participated in the relevant activity. The existing provision **of 1 % to 5% in Sports and ECA quota** is continued as per circular No. Aca.I / Sports / 2010-11 / 178 dated May 29, 2010.

Students selected on the basis of Sports/ECA are obliged to participate in these activities consistently. They shall be required to submit an undertaking at the time of admission affirming their commitment to represent the College and the University in their respective sport/ECA throughout the duration of their undergraduate programme.

Kindly refer to the University website and the college website/notice board from time to time for details of dates, and for any other changes.

The candidate submitting a false/fake certificate will be debarred from admission to any course in any College for three years. If a candidate is admitted on false/fake certificates, the candidate's admission will be cancelled, and such cases will be notified to all the Colleges.

Sports

Candidates seeking admission under the Sports Supernumerary Quota are advised to carefully read the notifications and guidelines issued by the University of Delhi on its official admission website. The merit list shall be prepared based on the candidate's CUET (UG) score and the evaluation of sports certificates in accordance with the norms prescribed by the University.

The level of sports competence shall be assessed based on distinctions and achievements attained during the four years immediately preceding the admission year. Sports trials, wherever applicable, shall be conducted strictly in accordance with the directions and guidelines issued by the University of Delhi. The College reserves the right to determine the number of seats to be filled under the Sports Quota, taking into consideration the availability of facilities, the requirements of the College sports teams, and other relevant factors.

Extra-curricular Activities (ECA)

The ECA Committee, constituted by the University, oversees ECA admissions. The candidates are chosen based on CUET Score, trial and their certificates. Weightage will be given to the certificates of winners/ participants at International, National, State, Zonal and School level. Fields that will be considered include Dance: Indian Classical and Choreography, Digital Media Photography, Digital Media Film Making, Fine Arts: Sketching, Painting and Sculpture, and Music: Vocal, Indian and Western.

Residence Hall Admissions

To promote inclusivity and enable a smoother transition to college life to a larger number of students from various parts of India in their first year, accommodation in the Residence Hall will be available to first-year students ONLY. All first-year students who will be admitted to the Residence Hall are hereby notified that they will have to make alternate arrangements for their stay in Delhi in their second and third years of study at the College. Students residing in the National Capital Region (NCR), particularly Gurugram, Faridabad, Ghaziabad, Nodia, and Greater Noida will not be eligible for the hostel. Admission is strictly on the basis of merit and please note that there are limited and a fixed number of seats available for each department, usually ranging from 1 to 3. Students can apply for admission to the hostel only after they have been admitted to the college. Hostel fees typically range from Rs. 11,000 to Rs. 15,000 per month, depending on the type of room allotted.

Disciplinary Norms

On admission, every student of the College is required to sign a declaration that she submits herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the personnel of the University and the College who may be vested with the authority to ensure discipline under the Acts, Statutes, Ordinances and Rules of the University/College. Each student, upon entry to the College, will be given a handbook containing the rules and regulations of the College. In addition, students will sign an affidavit declaring that if a student is found indulging in ragging, she will face disciplinary action according to the University Ordinance. Acts that may invite disciplinary action, fines or expulsion are detailed in the students' handbook and all students are required to follow the guidelines strictly.

Attendance Rules

In order to be allowed to appear for the University examination, every student (except for those in the B.El.Ed Programme) must have a minimum of 66.67% attendance in lectures/ practicals/ presentations/tutorials, in all the subjects, taken together each semester. Students of the B.El.Ed Programme must attend at least three-fourths of the lectures delivered and practicum held separately during each year of the programme. Students should check their attendance record monthly from the Students' Portal and keep checking notifications displayed on the College's website at lslr.edu.in. Students who do not meet the minimum attendance requirements shall not be permitted to take one or more papers in the University examinations. Students will not be considered for college

prizes, letters of recommendation, hostel facilities, or other benefits if they do not have at least 50% attendance. The University of Delhi rules state that students who are detained from appearing in any semester examination of any Under-graduate/post-graduate course due to shortage of attendance, will not be eligible for promotion to the next semester and will have to be considered for readmission in the next academic session to the same semester of the course in which they were detained.

Orientation

Orientation offers an invaluable introduction to college life at LSR. It serves as a vital starting point of the academic journey of all students, providing crucial insights into the inner workings, expectations, and culture of the College before classes officially commence. It is designed to ease your transition, demystify campus life, and help students feel fully integrated into their new environment. Apart from the college orientation, each department organises separate orientations for their students which facilitate students to familiarise themselves with course structures, assessment norms, and get introduced to their department faculty. Attendance is compulsory for all orientations.
